Easter greetings,

Alleluia! Jesus has risen! Alleluia!

Alleluia! We celebrate salvation by our God. Hopefully we celebrated a good Lenten season that cracked us open, turned us around, and crumbled the hardness of our heart. We can now see a difference in our relationships with others, with God and with ourselves? During Lent we discussed how: Almsgiving is another word for charity... meaning outreach to others; for example, we become more charitable in how we talk about or to others, there are so many ways to be charitable... Prayer is a way to connect with God. Prayer repairs our relationship to God, especially when we may have been forgetful to say: thanks, wow, oops, sorry. He wants us to also spend a little time waiting for Him to respond to our conversation. Prayer is a two-way street. Fasting repairs our relationship with ourselves. Fasting is to teach us that we have control over our body; we make the choice we are not driven just by desire. The secret is to now continue the practice and trust in our relationship with Jesus.

Alleluia! As part of the Easter celebration we bless Holy Water. It is a sacramental of the Church. Take a bottle home and use it to bless each other or your home. The bottles have a prayer to St. Michael on them. St Michael defends us against evil. Holy Water is a reminder of our baptism. God's promise of eternal life comes to us and today we see it fulfilled in His rising from the dead.

Alleluia! We will be celebrating Divine Mercy Sunday April 28th with a special gathering here at St. Philip's at 3 PM. This is a day to receive a Plenary Indulgence: remission of the punishment for sin... I like to phrase it: Have your purgatory clock set back to zero... Fr. Bryan and I will be available for reconciliation. You may offer your Plenary Indulgence for yourself or a person who have died. Please join in the celebration.

<u>Alleluia!</u> Our First Communicants (May 4th and 5th) and Confirmation candidates (May 19th) are busy getting ready to receive the gift of God's loving touch through these special sacraments. Please keep them in prayer.

Alleluia! The staff and I are filled with great appreciation for the many gifts God has given the members of our parishes: musicians, singers, lectors, ushers, gift-bearers, adorers, servers, Eucharistic Ministers, sacristans, art and environment. Grieving Resource Library

If you have lost a loved one, maybe you have felt one of the following during your grief: "It can't be, it just can't be; I never knew that it would hurt so much; part of my heart has been ripped away; no one ever told me that grief felt so much like fear; no one knows the tears still inside me; and finally, death leaves a heartache no one can heal, love leaves a memory no one can steal."

Where do I find help? At St. Philip's. We have started to develop a Grieving Resource Library. We currently have 30-some books and pamphlets that could help you through your grief of the loss of a loved one.

Some of the books we carry are:

Too Soon A Memory, a guide for parents suffering a miscarriage. This booklet focuses on the needs of parents who have to deal with a loss that involved tangible memories.

Journey Through Grief, a series of four books: Book one, A Time to Grieve, the three N's, normal, natural, necessary. Book two, Experiencing Grief, when your loss sinks in, accepting your grief, secondary losses. Book three, Finding Hope and Healing, how much longer God? How long does this last? Book Four, Rebuilding and Remembering, permission to grieve – again, the first anniversary, rebuilding your life, continuing bonds.

The books/pamphlets are located in the St. Kateri Room and can be checked out for 2 weeks or more if you need to. If you are not sure which book could assist you, contact either Fr. Chuck, Fr. Bryan, Deacon Kermit or Deacon Robb. "The journey of grieving takes you from loving in the presence to loving in the absence."


