It has been a while since I was able to write a column... will Tammy need to use small font?

The reading from Galatians Chapter 5: "Love your neighbor... If you go on biting and devouring one another beware that you are not consumed" ... this reminds me of the need to talk about <u>Gossip</u>. It is a terrible thing. Gossip is a sin and should be brought to confession. The Galatians had the attitude: He is no better than us and then proceeded to bring him down... Attitude is everything when it comes to gossip. We can do it maliciously and with a holier than thou attitude... we can add to a story and not even know the facts, we can say something we know is a direct lie, the result is the same, we make someone look low and we imply we are better than they are.

Gossip is a sin. It is one thing to state a fact but the reason we even mention it is where we can cross the line into sin. "Tom is in the hospital" is an OK thing to say if we only take it that far... Tom is in the hospital because he won't take his meds properly and hasn't done a bit of exercise in his life and I hear he even kicks the dog! Well that is just unkind and a terrible thing to say.

Sometimes families do not want to share information about an illness or an event that has happened we need to respect that right. Personally, I make it a point to proactively share openly all the details so that everyone knows the facts.

All of you are used to hearing gossip. Help put an end to a malicious story. The simplest way is to not repeat it. Or have courage and say either: "I do not believe that for a moment" or "Are you sure about those facts, it sounds a little farfetched to me..." If you are a person who engages in gossip remember to do the opposite... say something good about the person to offset the damage that has been done to reputation or character.

Here is a fact: Clarence Soley was a man who lived a simple life and loved being a teacher. He wanted to make sure his estate would be used to help youth. This last week we celebrated his funeral and announced the establishment of the Clarence Soley Endowment Fund. Soon this gift of \$400,000. will provide \$20,000 per year in funding to help families in need. Another gift from Clarence will provide the classroom furnishings and equipment necessary for the four new rooms used by both faith formation and the school. We are thankful for the gift and legacy he has left St. Philip's.

Here is a fact: the parish has reached an agreement with the owners of the Lakeview Dental Clinic for the purchase of the 603 Bemidji Ave. property and the vacant lot adjacent to the playground. Closing is set to happen late July or early August. This was in the parish long-range plan and the funds were in the budget of the capital campaign. We are thankful for this opportunity to provide for the future of St. Philip's.

Here is a fact: My recovery from the triple bypass has been going well, until pneumonia and pericardial effusion set in. That means: Slow down, take it easy, don't push too hard and I will get better. I was doing so well and pushed the envelope a little to hard. You notice the servers are there to help me during mass, Fr Bryan is doing good work as he covers many things for me. Bishop checks in on me and reminds me we need Holy, Happy, Healthy priests... meaning be smart and take the time to heal. The staff not only covers for me but, reminds me frequently to let them take care of the heavy lifting... I must learn to let go and let God (and others) be in charge.

Here is a fact: I love to be a listening ear for people especially about their lives, what is going on, events that concern them etc. I need to walk a lot every day. So, I thought why not combine the two: call me if you would like a 20 to 30 minute walk (at Diamond Point, to Paul and Babe and back, around the building here, the mall, or just downtown). If my schedule is open we can have time for Spiritual Direction, plain conversation, or a walking confession... I am open send an email, text, or leave a message, we will see of we can connect on a date and time. Kathy Pfann calls it: Walk a Priest!

FORMING FUTURE FATHERS by Gerald Korson

Your example plays a major role in shaping what kind of dad your son will be

Many years ago, I heard one of my young sons speak rudely to his mother, and something about his tone and attitude struck me as oddly familiar. It sounded a bit like a sharp, testy retort that might come from my lips after a stressful day at work. Even as I corrected my son for his behavior, I thought: "Did he get that from me?" If so, I resolved, I'd better start setting a better example.

The apple doesn't fall far from the tree, the saying goes. When it comes to raising children, you are that tree, especially for your sons. For better or for worse, your example — as a man, as a husband, as a father — will influence what kind of man, husband and father your boys will become.

All fathers know this from experience. Almost unconsciously, we usually model our parenting style after our own parents. There are times I say or do something that makes me think, "Wow, I'm becoming my dad." I've inherited his easy humor and sense of duty, but I've also taken on his occasional sarcasm and tendency toward workaholism. Inevitably, the blueprint we create as fathers is formative for our sons.

Here are five ways that you, by your example, can

help your sons to become good fathers.

Be a father who loves their mother. Good parenting begins with a good marriage. Show your children what a true Catholic gentleman is by how you treat your wife. Address her with love and respect, and defend her when she is treated disrespectfully by others, especially if the slights come from your children. If your sons learn to love and respect their mother, they will love and respect their own wives — and that will make them better fathers.

Be a father who prays. Real men pray, early and often. You are a spiritual leader of your family. Pray with your children while they are young, so that

they know how to pray on their own as they mature. Along with regular Mass and confession, practice grace at meals, read Scripture daily and pray the family rosary. Your sons will bring these prayerful habits to their own families.

Be a responsible father. As a husband and father, be attentive to your many duties. Demonstrate for your sons a strong work ethic and practice integrity in all things. St. Joseph is your model here, a man who understood his sacred vocation as a provider and protector of his family.

Be a father who is present to his family. Providing for your family can take you away from them more

> than you would like. Always remember that your work should serve your family, not the other way around. Make time for your wife and children, even just to listen to them and "waste time" with them.

Be a father who knows he's not perfect. The best role model you can present is that of a man who is struggling to become a saint. Your sons need to know that the habits and virtues you teach them are not easy to attain. You

sometimes fall short, and so will they — which is why we turn to prayer and the sacraments for grace and strength. Be man enough to admit this and to apologize when you lose patience, speak uncharitably or slip into laziness or self-centeredness.

Today, when my married sons visit us with their families, I often marvel that they turned out so well, in spite of my own failings. But I also like to think their good character was formed at least in part by my efforts to practice virtue as a husband and father, and I take pride in the fathers they've become.


