Brothers and Sisters.

Ever since my conversion in high school, it seems like there has frequently been a resource of some sort - a book, a person, a prayer, an audio presentation, etc - that has helped me grow in my faith. Sometimes those resources were helpful for growth up to a certain point, and then it was time for something new to come and lead me onward; other times those resources have become staples in my spiritual life and will remain so for the foreseeable future. A couple years ago, I found an excellent little book that continues to convict me, challenge me, and draw me into a deeper relationship with Jesus. It's written by St. Alphonsus Liguori (whose feast day was August 1st): Visits to the Blessed Sacrament and the Blessed Virgin Mary. This book, which guides a person through about a fifteen-minute prayer, has been powerful for me.

As Catholics, this is what we believe happens at every Catholic Mass: the priest prays over the bread and wine at the altar (this is called the Eucharistic Prayer) and they really change into the Body and Blood of Jesus. We believe this isn't some mere symbolic thing that happens, where we sort of wink at each other as though we are only pretending, but the Holy Spirit working through the priest really changes the bread and wine. The characteristics of bread and wine stay the same, but we believe there is a real change beneath the surface. This happens to fulfill Jesus' command in the sixth chapter of the Gospel of John, when he says we must eat his flesh and drink his blood if we are to have eternal life. The priest at Mass speaks the same words Jesus spoke during the Last Supper. This consecrated "bread and wine" (now the Body and Blood of Jesus) is called by a few different titles: Eucharist, Holy Communion, and/or the Blessed Sacrament. If we take time to really think about this, it's the most amazing thing that could happen - Jesus, who is God, comes to earth and wants us to consume him so he can live in us and give us strength to live his way of life. What a gift! After Communion time at Mass, we take what is left over of the consecrated hosts - what looks like bread, but we know to be the Body of Jesus - and place them in what's called a tabernacle (which is in our chapel here at St. Philip's). This means that Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament lives in a bodily way in our church here in Bemidji and in every Catholic church around the world. What is he doing there? He's waiting for you and for me to come and visit him. Read a little excerpt from St. Alphonsus:

'If, to show his love for him, a king were to go and live in the village of a poor shepherd, how ungrateful would that shepherd not be if he did not often go to visit him in spite of the fact that he knew the king was most anxious to see him frequently, and, indeed, that it was for this very purpose he had come to live there at all. Ah, my Jesus, well do I know that it is because of Your love for me that You have come to dwell in the Sacrament of the Altar!"

This little passage has really convicted me to visit our chapel more often. I wonder if we really consider enough how extraordinary it is that Jesus himself waits for us to visit him. I had been thinking about issuing a challenge to visit the chapel more often once Lent comes around, but now I can't help but wonder: Why wait until then? Jesus is waiting for you to visit. Come and satisfy his desire to spend time with you. Come often, even if you can only stay for a few minutes - he's so glad to have your company.



Safe Environment Training Volunteer Information



Volunteers at St. Philip's Parish and School (and throughout our Diocese) who have contact with children, youth and vulnerable adults must have yearly Safe Environment Training and must yearly fill out the Acknowledgement and Consent Form.

Safe Environment Certification begins July 1, 2019 and ends June 30, 2020. All Volunteers (Returning and New) should do the Safe Environment Training as soon as possible, to be Safe Environment Certified for this year. We

would like to have <u>ALL</u> Volunteers Safe Environment Certified by October 1, 2019. For example, if you did your Safe Environment Training May 13, 2019, please do your Safe Environment by the October 1 deadline. *Volunteers are not cleared to volunteer until the Safe Environment Training, the Acknowledgment and Consent Form, a current background check are completed, and a Safe Environment Certificate is issued to the Parish from the Diocese Safe Environment Office.*Completing the Safe Environment Training does not clear you to volunteer, a Safe Environment Certificate must be issued to the Parish's Safe Environment Office from the Diocese's Safe Environment Office, then you are cleared to volunteer – this could take up to two weeks to process. It is important to do the Safe Environment Training at least two, if not three weeks before volunteering.

Safe Environment Training is offered through the Diocese of Crookston. The training consists of reading Safe Environment Training materials and taking and passing a test. **The recommended method of training is on-line through the Diocese of Crookston Web Site – www.crookston.org** (follow the Safe Environment links). You should do the <u>NEW</u> Safe Environment Certification if you have never been Safe Environment Certified or if your last Safe Environment Certification is over two years expired, otherwise use the returning Safe Environment Certification. The **Acknowledgement and Consent Form** is also completed at this time. The Web-site is secure. After taking the test, the results should be displayed on the screen. Results can be printed, and a confirmation e-mail should be received of the test results. Please keep this e-mail in case there is a problem with the testing site. Failure to see results of the test or not receiving a confirmation e-mail could indicate there may be a problem with taking the test on-line. Try taking the test again and if you still have problems, contact Kris Jensen. A hard copy of the test is available by contacting the parish/school staff person who oversees you.


