In the final days, we'll all be called to stand before God, in hopes of entering the gates of heaven. As we hear from Jesus in this week's Gospel message, the gate, however, is a narrow one. We're required to focus our efforts in both a disciplined and zealous way. Once we stand before God to be judged, it will be too late for us to go back to change our ways.

On the day of judgement, all of mankind will see God's glory revealed. He will gather people from throughout the world into His presence. At that time:

- His glory will be revealed to us.
- We will see how He's been at work in our lives (whether or not we were aware of His work on our behalf at the time.)
- We'll understand all that He's done for our spiritual benefit, and ...
- Together, as brothers and sisters, we'll worship and give glory to God.

We're all God's beloved children. Everything God does for us is for our good. Even when what's going on in our lives doesn't make sense, we must always trust that God knows what he's doing. He teaches us through both good fortune and hardships. If things were always easy for us, we would take God's goodness for granted.

So, when we face challenges in our lives, we must use them to strengthen ourselves and spur us to greater discipline. Because we don't know when or where we'll be called before God, we have to work always to build-up our discipline, because discipline will steer us towards the joy that results from righteousness. And, when we reach that point, we will realize our struggles have been worth it. Entering through the Gates of heaven is our goal. Discipline, zeal, and concentration will lead us there.

During His earthly mission, Jesus' message was rejected more than it was accepted. He came to preach change and renewal, but most of the people preferred to be left as they were. It's hard for us to change our ways. We like to have things our own way and usually prefer to take the path of least resistance in our spiritual journey. The easy way out. But our desire for heaven by itself, isn't enough; discipline is required. Without it, we won't be able to enter through the narrow gate.

At the final moment, the decision for our salvation will have been made. Those who didn't listen to Jesus will be considered evildoers, and it will be too late to go back and change their ways. Let us be among those who heard Jesus' message and disciplined ourselves to stay focused on it.


