Happy Twenty-Third Sunday in Ordinary Time,

September 8, 2019

The new school year is off to a great start here at St. Philip's. We celebrated our first all-school Mass of the year this past Wednesday. It is a blessing to celebrate the great feast of the Mass together with all the students and staff! We are blessed to be able to experience Jesus in this way!

Now that the school year is started it is also time to start our RCIA classes for the year. RCIA (Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults) is the process by which adults who are not baptized and confirmed in the Catholic faith can learn more about our faith, and then decide if they would like to become full confirmed members of our faith family.

The RCIA classes are open to baptized or unbaptized non-Catholics, as well as those who were baptized Catholic, but have not yet received the Sacraments of Eucharist and/or Confirmation.

Our RCIA sessions provide teaching and formation in several areas including, Sacred Scripture, prayer, liturgy, what Catholics believe and how we can live out what we believe.

Our first session will be held at 10:15 AM on Sunday, September 29, in the St Kateri Room. All materials will be provided and there is no cost to participants. Sessions are scheduled for Sunday mornings at 10:15 so that participants may attend the 9:00 AM Mass and then attend the RCIA session. The sessions generally last about an hour. We meet an average of two Sundays per month for about seven months and would culminate with the participants who want to join the church receiving the Sacraments of Initiation during the Easter Vigil Mass.

So, if you or someone you know is interested in becoming Catholic or just knowing more about the Catholic faith, I would recommend attending the session on September 29. For more information please contact Deacon Robb or Deacon Kermit at the Parish Office. Our contact information is listed in the column to the left of this letter.

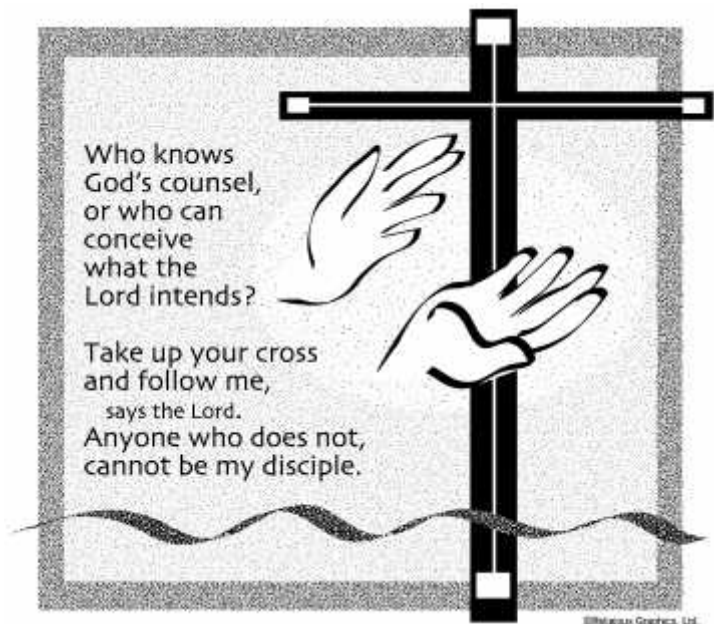
