Greetings on this Twenty-Fourth Sunday in Ordinary Time!

September 15, 2019

This week's Sunday Gospel reminds us of the merciful love that God the Father has for all of us, His children. Jesus depicts so poignantly the love found in the character of the father who as he sees him in the distance, runs out to greet his wayward son before he's even home ... and who celebrates his son's safe return with a feast. This is a favorite story of mine, one that's now easier to relate to, as I've played, as many of you have, both roles with my own father and my own son.

Without my experiences, I might have wondered how a father can so quickly and completely forgive a son who prematurely took a share of the father's wealth (which in Jesus' time was a scandal and meant that the son considered his father to be dead). The son took his share, abandoned the family and wasted the hard-earned money on immoral and reckless acts. But, Jesus reminds us, as he did the Pharisees and scribes at the beginning of the Gospel, that God the Father Himself is merciful, for sending Jesus to encourage sinners to turn away from their sins and back towards God.

These readings challenge us on many levels. If we're like the younger, prodigal son, it might be hard to imagine that God could forgive us for the wrongs we might have done, for the times that we turned away from God. But in this weekend's second reading, Paul reminds Timothy that God not only forgave him for his persecution of the Church, he then called Paul to great glory as an Apostle. Paul describes himself as the foremost of sinners, who "was mercifully treated, so that in me, as the foremost, Christ Jesus might display all his patience as an example for those who would come to believe in him for everlasting life.," (1 Timothy 1:16). Through His mercy for Paul, the most zealous persecutor of the early Christian Church, Jesus gave Paul the grace to become one of his greatest advocates and one of the most outstanding supporters of the Church. If any of us feels that we've committed some wrong that can't be forgiven ... or have strayed from the Church for so long that we can't be welcomed back ... we can take courage and comfort from Paul's story.

But, just as the readings encourage us to accept the mercy of God, they also challenge us to extend God's mercy to others. For we also know that the measure we give to others is what we'll receive. We're forgiven, as we forgive. This is what we ask for when we recite the Lord's Prayer. And we have this good news to share with anyone who needs to hear it: come home! And, when those who are lost come back home, let us then extend God's mercy to them, as we've been forgiven by our Heavenly Father.



 - 4. You'll be challenged, you'll have fun, and you'll make new friends.
 - 3. It is a rewarding experience. You get to know the children/youth, the special gifts they have and learn from them!
 - 2. You'll be helping children/youth deepen their relationship with Jesus.
- 1. It's our job: Jesus sent us to "go and teach all nations."

Many teaching options are available – team teach with another parent/friend, that way you can take turns teaching lessons and have someone else in the class; be an Elementary Assistant Catechist in the classroom, you don't have to teach, just be an extra hand in the classroom; be a Security Monitor (you do not have to be Catholic), help us to maintain a Safe Environment for the children and youth who attend Faith Formation on Wednesday nights; many other volunteer opportunities are available. All volunteers must complete the Diocese's Safe Environment Training.






