30th Sunday Ordinary Time Greetings,

October is the month we celebrate life and the variety of vocations we may be called to in life. Marriage is so important to our society and families: we need to remind ourselves to pray for and support those who are getting married, those who are married, and those who have found it necessary to end their marriage through divorce. Prayer for marriage is one way we can demonstrate in a very real way the depth of our support of marriage as a union of one man and one woman.

David Blankenhorn, president of the Institute for American Values and a self-described liberal Democrat, said of marriage, "Marriage is a gift that society bestows on its next generation. Marriage, and only marriage, unites the three core dimensions of parenthood – biological, social and legal – into one pro-child form: the married couple. Marriage says to a child: The man and woman whose sexual union made you, will also be there to love and raise you. Marriage says to society as a whole: For every child born, there is a recognized mother and father, accountable to the child and to each other."

We also acknowledge that not everyone is called to the vocation of marriage and that some marriages end in divorce. When a marriage ends in divorce, we as Catholics encourage the seeking of a Declaration of Nullity (annulment). The process can be confusing, and some information is misunderstood. For example: one person thought we charged a huge fee...in the Diocese of Crookston, there is no charge. Another individual stated they wanted the annulment so they could receive Communion again: a divorced person may receive Holy Communion if they have not entered another marital relationship prior to the annulment. It is important to seek guidance and help to clarify the situation.

November 1st is the feast of All Saints, a Holy Day of Obligation. Please attend one of the Masses we have scheduled. Mark your calendar for November 19th at 6:30 PM... we will celebrate a Mass of Remembrance in honor of all the loved ones who have died in the last year. This special Mass will be followed by a time to socialize and share memories with one another.

Near the Baptismal font there will be a book where we write the names of friends and family who have died. We want to honor their memory and bring them in prayer to our Lord for His blessing. Bring your list of all who have died (no matter when) and add them to the book. Parents, grandparents, siblings, children, friends, those who have no one to pray for them... we would like to list them all.

We offer our sympathy to the families. We are reminded how difficult death is even when we expect it. Thank you to the many that made time in their schedules to be there and support the families on their loss. Thanks to the many who offered food and assistance with the wakes and funeral meals. We can be Jesus to others through acts of kindness, especially at times of loss. Eternal rest grant unto them O Lord!

May you all have a great week. Tell someone you love them. Jesus loves you and so do I. Blessings.




