From the desk of Aana Freihammer

November 3, 2019

I am very sad to announce to you that I will be leaving St. Philip's at the end of this year. I have accepted a position doing liturgy and music in my hometown of Brainerd, Minnesota. We will be in the same city as both of our parents and closer to our siblings. We will also be closer to the Mayo Clinic. As many of you remember, Abigail received a heart transplant two years ago, and is doing very well, but her transplant requires lifelong monitoring, and getting closer to Mayo will help us manage her ongoing care.

This is a heart-breaking move for us. We have been very happy living in Bemidji, and I love working for St. Philip's as your Director of Liturgy and Music. We also feel indebted to this wonderful community, Fr. Chuck, and the entire staff at St. Philip's who have supported us in so many ways during our daughter's medical issues. We want you to know how much we appreciate all you have done for us.

I have loved every parish I have worked, and St. Philip's is no different. This vibrant parish in the middle of the Northern Minnesota woods is a loving, hardworking community. You have inspired my faith life, cared for my family, and I am eternally grateful.

If you have ever watched the sitcom *Cheers* you know that the premise of the show surrounds a group of misfit characters gathering around every evening to share a drink. Who can forget the catchy theme song *Sometimes you want to go, where everybody knows your name!*' The most iconic scene is Norm walking into the bar, while everyone in the bar stops what they are doing to call out 'Norm!'. As a liturgist, I can't help but fall in love with the theology of community that developed around all these flawed characters as they kept showing up to the same place. They became better people because of the relationships they developed. *Our family is better because we were loved by St. Philip's*.

If you are someone in the pews who feels anonymous in the parish, I encourage you to go deeper into the St. Philip's community. Anonymity can feel safe, but you will miss out on the chance of loving deeply and going deeper in your relationship with God. Do not let yourself be anonymous, you will reap the benefits of this wonderful community the more you get to know people and build your relationships. Of course, in every parish there are going to be human frustrations, disagreements, disappointments, and difficult personalities. Just like any family, the parish community is not for the faint of heart. You will have to work hard, and you will be annoyed at times, but the benefits far outweigh the difficulties. If one ministry doesn't work out, try another, the fruit of your generous gift will come back ten-fold. St. Philip's is a light in the darkness, and an antidote to the pressures in the outside culture that does not value God. Where else in the world can you celebrate the Eucharist with your neighbors and family? Don't take for granted this wonderful parish community. Go deep into your parish, keep showing up, and you will find God's loving presence.

Although my position has been posted, I will still be here at St. Philip's through Christmas. I am confident God will provide a wonderful director to continue the great growth in our liturgy and music programs. Please keep us in your prayers, and you will be in ours.



Marriage Banns (c 1067) refers to the public announcement of a proposed marriage. The purpose of the Marriage Banns is to offer the faithful the opportunity to exercise their obligation to reveal to the pastor any impediments to a proposed marriage (c. 1069). The following are impediments to Marriage:

Holy Orders. Has the groom ever been ordained a deacon or a priest in the Catholic Church?

Public **perpetual vow** of chastity in a religious institute. Has either the bride or the groom been a member of a religious community?

Crime. (killing someone's spouse with the view of marrying the surviving spouse)

Age. Will either the pride or the groom be under the age of 14 or 16 respectively, at the time of the wedding? (Civil law states a person needs the consent of the parents if under the age of 18.)

Antecedent and perpetual **impotence**. Is the bride or groom incapable of sexual intercourse because of injury or some other medical or psychological condition?

Marriage. Has either the bride or the groom been married previously? Has the previous marriage received a declaration of nullity?

Abduction. Refers to the kidnapping of a person who later becomes engaged to the kidnapper.

Consanguinity: Blood relationship between persons who descend from a common ancestor in all degrees of the direct line (Father-daughter or Mother-son), and to up to the fourth degree of the collateral line (first cousins). Are the bride and groom related to one another by blood?

Affinity (relationships because of marriage) any degree in the direct line. Are the bride and groom related through marriage?

Adoption. Are the bride and groom related through adoption?

Public Propriety. The impediment arises from an invalid marriage after the establishment of common life or from notorious or public concubinage (cohabitation between a man and a woman without marriage.). It nullifies marriage in the first degree of the direct line between the man and the blood relatives of the woman, and vice versa (c. 1093).

One Man and One Woman. Sex change or reassignment. Has either the bride or groom lived as the opposite sex or had surgery to physically alter their gender? (c. 1056)

Greetings, November 2, 2019

National Vocation Awareness Week is upon us. It is a week in which we are reminded of the need to foster the priestly and religious vocations that God has sown in the hearts of his children.

I would like to give you a snapshot of the state of priestly vocations in the Diocese of Crookston. It takes 6–8 years for a man to journey through seminary to priestly ordination. Within the next 6–8 years, 14 of our 37 active priests will be eligible to retire. We currently have 4 seminarians. This is not a reason to despair, because the Lord always provides for his Church. However, it is a reason for us to ask the question: **Are we doing all we can to foster and support vocations to the priesthood and religious life within our diocese?** Although God calls, we have a part to play in helping that call come to fruition. With that in mind, I ask you to join me in a couple of simple things to assist in the unfolding of a vocation.

First, please regularly pray and offer small sacrifices for this intention. Ask the master of the harvest to send out laborers for his harvest (Mt 9:28). Are you willing to spend time in Eucharistic adoration each week praying for the vocations we need? Are you willing to give up something on Fridays as a sacrifice of love, offering it up for an increase in vocations to the priesthood within our diocese? Are you willing, on a regular basis, to do this for someone in whom you sense a priestly vocation? How can we expect a man to devote his entire life to God's people as a priest if God's people will not devote an hour a week for his vocation?

Second, please offer a word of encouragement to someone in whom you sense a priestly vocation. Don't be weird or pushy; simply say what you have to say and leave the results to God. Have you ever thought of being a priest? I think you'd be great because... Perhaps the Lord wants to use your voice to issue his call. Perhaps the man being called is your son, grandson, or nephew. Words of encouragement are a powerful force in bringing a vocation to fulfillment.

It is beautiful to see someone live out fully their God-given vocation. It is a gift for the one called and a gift for others.
