Greetings on the Feast of Christ the King,

This Sunday marks the end of the church liturgical year, next Sunday we celebrate the new liturgical year; the 1st Sunday of Advent. As I age time seems to be moving faster and faster.

Clear communication is becoming more difficult and more necessary especially when it is done in sound bites and 140 characters. Texting does not allow for the emotions to be expressed in sound and body language. I wonder if we are forgetting how to listen. When working with families/couples who are having communication issues I frequently will ask them: what did you hear your spouse/child say? I suggest before they respond they pause, take a breath and then start by saying: "I heard you say..." If the answer is "yes, that is what I said" then they can respond... if not then they must take the time to listen again and make sure they have it right before they can respond.... These types of conversations will take 2 to 3 times longer but will have more meaning...

As a society, we struggle to listen first and then only prepare our response. Many times, we have our response already prepared before the individual has completed sharing their thoughts. "A pause, and then, What I heard you say..." could clean up confusion.

Another approach to conversation that needs thought and action: Do you tend to talk more than listen? My dad's pearl of wisdom that he shared with "Charlie" on more than one occasion: one mouth, two ears... why do you think that is? Just for today, for practice, try to listen to your spouse/child as much as you talk at them.

Thanksgiving Day is this week and the traditional beginning to the shopping, baking, gift giving, party season starts. Families may experience stress and concern over how much and when to spend. Take time for some quiet and peace in your home. Set aside time for hot chocolate and some of those cookies. It is important for parents to be on the same page especially during a high stress season. Take time to have a hot drink after the kids go to bed. Make sure you set aside a certain time, the TV is off and conversation on... Sometimes it is, "dying to self" and what you want to do, but be present to the other person, it will pay dividends in the temperament around the house.

I am thankful for the rituals of the Catholic Church. They enrich us and allow us to grow in faith as a community. I am thankful for the peace and calm that comes over a person who receives the sacrament of the anointing of the sick. Just ask anyone who has been anointed how they feel afterwards. I am thankful for the large number of people who take time to attend daily mass. It is a testament to me of the belief in the true presence of Jesus and how much our faith calls us to have Him a part of our lives. I am thankful for the number of parents who bring their children forward for baptism; their desire to pass on the faith is commendable. I am thankful for the large number of people who participate in Faith Formation, Bible studies, small groups, and RCIA classes, lifelong learning is a challenge and is also rewarding to those who venture forth.

I am thankful for the many people who have opened their lives to me as your priest. You have allowed me in and shown me the great capacity that God has for love. I am thankful I am in this place, at this time, and among you God's chosen people. Jesus loves you and so do I.


