Let Every Heart Prepare Him Room

December 22, 2019

As some of you know, my family and I are in the process of moving. We spent torturous days cleaning, packing, purging, and hiding every stray toy, blanket, and clothing. We were overwhelmed with our piles of junk, and random boxes we've saved for years. By the time we were done, our house looked so put together and organized. Some rooms even looked like a magazine cover. We loved our house before, but now everything looked even better! We even felt like we could have people come over (GASP!) After a while, though, our home felt uncomfortable, even fake. Our home had become almost too perfect. I began to feel like we had to 'hide our life' in order to have someone come into our life. Our perfect house gave the impression that we were perfect, and kept everything tidy, but the truth is that we live with dirty clothes, toys on the floor, we normally even have dishes in the sink. Why is it that we had to hide every aspect of our imperfections in order to feel comfortable having someone over to our house?

At Christmas, we celebrate the coming of Christ as a baby. Think for a minute how bizarre that sentence is—"Christ became a baby, a *human*." God became fully and completely *man*. This theological truth is the incarnation. Since the fall of Adam, humanity has been waiting for the one foretold by the prophets. The prophet Isaiah reveals that he would be called 'Emmanuel' meaning 'God with us.' Jesus fulfilled Isaiah's revelation by becoming fully man at Christmas. This dual nature of Jesus tells us two things- because God is divine, he knows everything in our lives—our joys, temptations, failures, shortcomings. Because he was fully human, he knows what it feels like to struggle as a human.

Romano Guardini writes: "Jesus was no cold Superman—he was more human than any of us. Entirely pure, unweakened by evil, he was loving and open to the core. His ardor, truth, sensitivity, power, capacity for joy and pain were unlimited, and everything that happened to him happened in the immeasurableness of his divinity."

Christmas celebrates Christ coming into our lives. We do not have to keep our hearts closed off to him until we perfectly tidied our hearts. On the contrary, we can't get the house clean without His grace coming into our lives. Christ has done it all and been through it all, so we do not have to hide our shame, we don't have to hide our dirty laundry or the dust, we can honestly and openly open wide the doors of our hearts and let him deep inside our struggles. He knows we (and our homes) are not perfect and he loves us completely despite the messiness. Christmas celebrates the theological truth that God is not a self-righteous deity condemning the world from a throne in the sky but wants to intimately be a part of our lives, this is where the grace begins. "The eternal and infinite God immersed himself in human finiteness, in his creature, to bring back man and the whole of creation to himself." (*Pope Benedict, General Audience 1/9/2013*)

On behalf of our family and all the staff at St. Philip's, Merry Christmas! I pray that you have the profound experience of the incarnational Christ in your hearts.

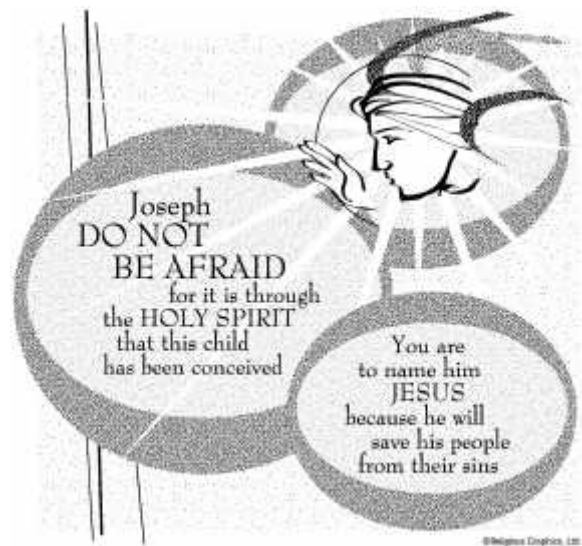
