Merry Christmas! Happy Epiphany!

What a great few weeks we've had! One of the things I love about being Catholic is all of the great days we have to recall the different ways the Lord has interrupted the patterns of history, in order to "bring straying humanity back to its original holiness" (Preface for Holy Virgins and Religious). Of course, we ought to recall his wondrous mercy at all times, but sometimes it's a little too easy to forget, so the Church has all of these great Feast Days and Solemnities for us to be reminded. Sometimes those reminders demand of us a little extra effort in practicing our faith (read: Holy Days of Obligation), but this is the best kind of effort - greater effort to know, love, and serve God.

In my mind, "this time of the year" begins at the beginning of November with the Solemnity of All Saints (November 1st, a Holy Day of Obligation) and then with the Commemoration of All the Faithful Departed (November 2nd, All Souls' Day). These are two great reminders to us that we will be judged and so need to rely on the intercession and example of the saints in Heaven, while also praying for those who have died, that they may find in God a merciful judge. From there, we finish with the final Sundays of Ordinary Time, including the great Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe (the last Sunday of Ordinary Time). Then we have a great season where the Church invites us to rekindle our longing for the return of Jesus, when this world as we know it will come to an end and the New Jerusalem will come out of the heavens and will last for all eternity. It's a beautiful season for us to be purified and renewed by our joyful waiting for the return of Jesus the Bridegroom. And now, of course, we are in these great days of Christmas celebration. We call to memory the gratuitous gift of God, a gift that we did not deserve, when he sent his son, Jesus, to wage war for us against the devil. Last weekend, in spite of the snow storm, we took some time to reflect on the Holy Family of Jesus, Mary, and Joseph. On Wednesday of this past week, we celebrated the Octave Day of Christmas by rejoicing in Mary's motherhood. And now this weekend we recall the visitation of the Magi who came from a great distance simply to offer Jesus those precious gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh.

Whew! What a great time of the year for us! My hope and prayer is that you are as excited about these days as I am. More importantly, I hope and pray we all are as excited about these days as God is. Can you imagine how fondly he looks back on all of these great events in history? (Of course, I know he works outside of time and doesn't actually "look back" on anything, but it's a fun thing to think about anyway. I hope you'll forgive my human way of speaking about God.) This is also a great time for us to look back on our relationship with God. Do you have some monumental moments in your own life, memories that you can look back upon with great fondness, because they launched you into a deeper relationship with the Holy Trinity? I hope you have many of those moments, and I hope and pray for many more such moments for you in your life moving forward.

May the Lord give you his peace! *Fr. Bryan*


