Happy Fifth Sunday in Ordinary Time,

February 9, 2020

Our scripture readings this weekend are all about action. About doing and being what God calls us to. In Isaiah we are called to share our food with hungry, shelter the oppressed and the homeless, clothe the naked and to not turn your back on your own. In Paul's letter to the Corinthians we are encouraged to let our faith rest not on human wisdom but on the power of God. And in Matthew we are called to be salt for the earth and a light for the world. We are called to action!

Each and everyone of us is called by God through our baptism to discipleship. To help spread the good news that Jesus Christ is Lord and Savior.

This weekend, here at St. Philip's, we are looking at a little deeper calling that Deacon Robb and I have experienced. A call that I believe a few other men in our parish may be receiving. A call to do a little more for their faith and for their God.

Many years ago, I realized that God had provided me with many gifts in my life. A great wife, two wonderful children, a large extended family and countless friends that all made my life great. He also gifted me with many talents. I realized that I needed to do more for him with my life than I was doing. So, with gratitude I prayed for God to show me what he wanted from me.

About that same time, I went on a Koinonia retreat, and while on the retreat I met a man by the name of Jim Lukenbill. Jim is a Deacon from Baudette. Jim and I had a lot in common and I greatly respected him and his faith journey. I began to wonder if this is what God had in mind for me, to become a Deacon. So, I prayed for guidance and a sign. I did not ever receive a lightning bolt type of a sign telling me that I should become a Deacon, but I received many little signs. The rest of this story is still playing out.

I, have the opportunity, to give back to God. To share my life and my faith every day with my family, my parish family and with everyone I encounter. It is a good life! A blessed life!

As a Deacon I am blessed to be able to bring Jesus to our family members who are in our local nursing homes, visit inmates at the Beltrami County Jail, help couples prepare for marriage, walk with candidates and catechumens as they prepare to join the church and share with our children in our RF program and school. I also am blessed to assist families in saying goodbye while leading wakes and funerals. Assisting at Mass and sharing my faith walk in homilies is also a gift.

I feel the most blessed when I celebrate the Sacrament of Marriage with a couple and when I celebrate the Sacrament of Baptism with a child. Being able to be the instrument through whom God works is amazing!

If you are a Catholic man, between the ages of thirty and sixty, who is grateful to God for who he is in your life and what he has done for you, I challenge you to pray. Pray to God, asking him, do you want me to do more for you? If so, do you want me to ask for more information about the possibility of becoming a Deacon! The Diocese will be starting a new deacon formation class in about 18 months. Now is the time to start praying about this and asking Deacon Robb, Deacon Kermit or Father Chuck some questions. As I said earlier in this letter, **being a Deacon is a good and blessed life!**

STATEMENT RE: BISHOP HOEPPNER INVESTIGATION

February 4, 2020 – Archbishop Bernard A. Hebda of the Archdiocese of Saint Paul and Minneapolis has recently been authorized by the Congregation for Bishops in Rome, to conduct further investigation related to claims that Bishop Michael J. Hoeppner had engaged in "acts or omissions intended to interfere with or avoid civil or canonical investigations of clerical sexual misconduct" as prescribed by the motu proprio, Vos estis lux mundi. Judge Timothy O'Malley (email: omalleyt@archspm.org), Director of the Archdiocesan Office of Ministerial Standards and Safe Environment, will serve as the Archbishop's Delegate for that investigation. The Congregation has also specified that for the duration of the investigation, the faculty to deal with cases of sexual abuse against clerics of the Diocese of Crookston has been transferred from Bishop Hoeppner to Archbishop Hebda.


