Greetings in Christ Jesus,

March 1, 2020

There is a tale for Lent that comes from a far-off place. One day, the Devil decided to close up shop in a certain part of the world, so he decided to hold a fire sale and an attitude auction. Some evil people were pleased to get his tools like fear, ignorance and prejudice and be able to play his infernal games at half price.

But one person seeking to be more spiritual and caring, wandered into the shop. Intensely curious, he looked around at all the tricks of deception and the tools of malice, until he spotted the quality on the highest shelf that had the highest price. Boldly, he asked the devil what that quality was, and why was it so expensive. The devil replied, "That is discouragement. Why is it so expensive? That's simple. It's my favorite. With the tool of discouragement, I can pry into any person or any group and cause all kinds of havoc and damage."

On this first Sunday of Lent, the readings have a rather demonic theme. In the book of Revelation the ancient serpent is identified as Satan, and this is rather significant because in Hebrew, Satan literally means the accuser. Satan, in his arrogance, despises God's generosity and he looks down on human existence as totally inferior to his own. Thus, Satan has set out to prove that mankind is unworthy of God's love and friendship, and the story of Genesis might suggest that Satan has been rather successful.

After the Fall, one can imagine Satan the accuser saying to God, 'Look, I was right all along: mankind is weak and untrustworthy and doesn't want your grace and friendship.' This is the point that Satan has been trying to prove ever since.

But although in sinning, we reject God's love and friendship, God never rejects us. God, in becoming incarnate in Jesus Christ totally undermines Satan's evil scheming. The Incarnation shows once and for all that mankind is capable of being friends with God, and Jesus Christ, through His life, death and resurrection, makes this divine friendship possible for the whole of humanity.

With its wonderful traditions and symbols, Lent provides a perfect opportunity for your family to celebrate together. Here are some suggestions for making the most of Lent: As a family, observe the practice of not eating meat on Fridays. Remember that the purpose of this tradition is to make a sacrifice. Meatless Fridays are now also seen as a sign of solidarity with the hungry multitudes worldwide. In addition to abstaining from meat on Fridays, do some abstaining from the television or other types of media, such as the computer or video-game system. Use the time to do activities together as a family, such as taking a walk or playing a game.

Put some extra effort into your decision as to what your Lenten sacrifice will be this year. And remember that doing something can be just as good as giving something up. Whatever you decide will be your Lenten sacrifice, draw a picture and post it on the refrigerator where everyone can see—this will help you honor your commitment. For instance, if you're giving up watching a certain television program, draw a picture of one of the characters. Or, if you're going to make an effort to play more with your brother or sister, draw a picture of the two of you playing together.

Lent is a season of grace. The joy of the Risen Lord Jesus depends on how we live out the holy season of Lent. God's generosity has no limits. Let us always rejoice in the season of Lent, which is a gift and blessing for us every Church year.

I wish you well in celebrating Lent in whatever way makes sense to you as a child of our loving God.

FoodShare Drive Next Weekend

The annual FoodShare Drive to raise money for the Bemidji Community Food Shelf (BCFS) will be held during March 7-8 Masses. This is the BCFS major fund raiser of the year with partial donations matched by the Greater Minneapolis Community Connections organization.



A table will be staffed by members of the parish's youth formation organization in the narthex before and after each Mass that weekend. Parishioners who volunteer at the BCFS will be on hand to answer questions.

The Knights of Columbus have pledged to match the first \$500 donated during the weekend while four anonymous parishioners have each pledged to match the second, third, fourth and fifth \$500 in donations. Last year the St. Philip's FoodShare Drive raised over \$5,600.

Vocation Chalice Ministry

The purpose of the **Vocation Chalice Ministry** is to encourage families to pray and promote vocations to the Priesthood, Religious Life and all kinds of vocations in humanity. The consecrated Chalice is a tangible reminder of this special intention for the Church.

Praying for vocations is the most powerful way to support vocations. When we pray for vocations, we lift up to our Father those men and women whom He is calling to follow Him in a very special way.

The chalice itself is a visual reminder of the importance of Christ's body and blood as central to our faith and the role of the priest at Mass.

Here's how it works:

- Each week at Sunday Mass, an assigned family is called by the Priest to come forward to receive the Chalice box and a blessing.
- The family that receives the Chalice, takes it home and puts it in a place of honor.
- Each day for a week, the family prays for an increase and perseverance of vocations.
- On the following Friday, the host family returns the Chalice to the church office for another family to take home.
- Our Parish begins this ministry on the First Sunday of Lent: March 1st 2020.
- A Chalice Box will be given to a family at each of the four weekend Masses.
- You may sign up according to your convenience prescribing the date and time. Sign up by doing so on the ministry scheduler online, or call the Parish Office, 444-4262.
