The Second Sunday of Lent;

March 8, 2020

How is your Lent going? Have you been mindful of the presence of God in your life? Lent is a reminder for us to reflect on if every aspect of our life includes God and faith. Do we place our trust in our heavenly Father? Do we treat our families, friends and neighbors as if our faith and our trust in the word of God matters? God has called us to be holy! May we strive to live a holy life.

In today's Gospel Jesus is transfigured in front of Peter, James and John. They are provided with the vision of Jesus, conversing with Moses and Elijah. They were blessed to be able to see Jesus in his glory, hearing the voice of God say, "This is my beloved Son, with whom I am well pleased, listen to him." When the disciples heard this, they fell prostrate and were very much afraid. Jesus touched them saying, "rise and do not be afraid."

We are blessed every time we celebrate Mass to be able to see Jesus, in the Word and in the Eucharist. We receive him into our body and are to take him out into the world, living our lives, in the love of God. May we do our very best to carry out his mission.

We have a new opportunity here at St. Philip's to help carry out the mission. We have four Vocations Chalice, which we can take turns bringing into our homes for a week at a time. We can bring one of the chalices into our home, set it up in a place of honor and each day spend some extra time in prayer for vocations. The Catholic Church worldwide and in our Diocese is in need of good, holy men to be open to God's call to the priesthood and the diaconate. We are also in need of good, holy women to be open to the call to religious life.

This past week Marlene and I brought one of the Vocations Chalices into our home and invested some extra time in prayer for vocations. It has been good for us to together share this extra time in prayer. I would like to encourage families to consider being a part of this ministry. You can do it once (for one week) or you may decide to sign up for this ministry on a regular monthly basis (one week a month).

I pray that you and your family have a blessed Lent.

FoodShare Drive This Weekend

The annual St. Philip's FoodShare Drive is being held this weekend. The drive supports the work of the Bemidji Community Food Shelf, which last year provided 925,000 pounds of food to area residents who were facing food insecurity.

Need for such a program is obvious. The BCFS ranked as the 15th busiest of the 331 in Minnesota event though the city is the 71st largest in the state.

The Knights of Columbus have pledged to match the first \$500 donated during the weekend while four anonymous donors have each pledged to match the second, third, fourth and fifth \$500 in donations.

Vocation Chalice Ministry

The purpose of the **Vocation Chalice Ministry** is to encourage families to pray and promote vocations to the Priesthood, Religious Life and all kinds of vocations in humanity. The consecrated Chalice is a tangible reminder of this special intention for the Church.

Praying for vocations is the most powerful way to support vocations. When we pray for vocations, we lift up to our Father those men and women whom He is calling to follow Him in a very special way.

The chalice itself is a visual reminder of the importance of Christ's body and blood as central to our faith and the role of the priest at Mass.

Here's how it works:

- Each week at Sunday Mass, an assigned family is called by the Priest to come forward to receive the Chalice box and a blessing.
- The family that receives the Chalice, takes it home and puts it in a place of honor.
- Each day for a week, the family prays for an increase and perseverance of vocations.
- On the following Friday, the host family returns the Chalice to the church office for another family to take home.
- Our Parish begins this ministry on the First Sunday of Lent: March 1st 2020.
- A Chalice Box will be given to a family at each of the four weekend Masses.
- You may sign up according to your convenience prescribing the date and time. Sign up by doing so on the ministry scheduler online, or call the Parish Office, 444-4262.

And as a ministry of Service, deacons carry out all manner of works of charity from visiting the sick, caring for the poor, and participating in prison ministry among many other Corporal and Spiritual Works of Mercy. There are currently five Deacon Candidates discerning a call to the Permanent Diaconate who are in their second year of formation – please pray for them. The next group of men will gather for the first year of formation (called the Aspirancy year) in 2021-2022. While this may seem well into the future, if you are considering the Diaconate (or think someone else should) you are encouraged to talk with your priest and to also contact Deacon Mark Krejci, Director of Deacon Formation (mkrejci@crookston.org), so that they can both pray for you and provide you with further information.

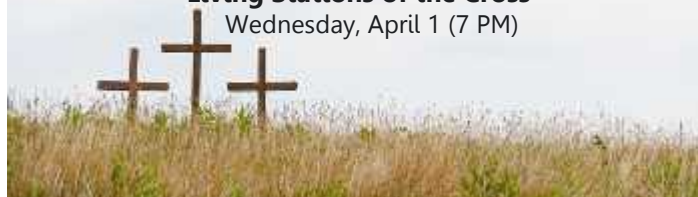
