Happy 5th Sunday of Lent!

Though for many of us, it doesn't feel like Lent, and chances are it won't 'feel' like Easter either in a couple weeks.

During Lent we typically spend MORE time at our parish, not less – noon Mass on Tuesday, Reconciliation service, soup lunch, Stations of the Cross, Friday Fish Fry, choir practice for the Triduum. Through these activities we strive to deepen our faith and connect, even more, with our parish brothers and sisters. Now, this year, because of the virus, we cannot partake in any of these seasonal, faith-building, community building, activities. And of course, the suspension of all public Masses has turned our weekly spiritual routine upside down.

As He promised, Jesus Christ is always with us, but the power of Christ in the Eucharist is paramount to our Catholic faith. We miss the Mass. We miss the comradery. We especially miss the Eucharist.

In these weeks, we still can stay connected to one another, to our parish and to our faith. Here are a few ideas:

Fr. Chuck and Fr. Maschio pray for each of you every day! The mass that they pray on Wednesdays along with the Sunday Mass, is recorded and put on St. Philip's website. In this way we can hear from our own priests, see them and still feel a connection with the parish. Don't slouch on the couch like you'd watch a tv show! Shut off all distractions, gather others in your household and watch and pray together. Pray the Spiritual Communion prayer as the priest is receiving Holy Communion: *My Jesus, I believe that You are present in the Most Holy Sacrament. I love You above all things, and I desire to receive You into my soul. Since I cannot at this moment receive You sacramentally, come at least spiritually into my heart. I embrace You as if You were already there and unite myself wholly to You. Never permit me to be separated from You. Amen.* Even though we cannot attend Sunday mass in person, strive always to keep holy the Lord's Day in your home.

An excellent daily Mass option is Bishop Barron's daily Mass. It can be found at <https://www.wordonfire.org/daily-mass/> Remember to pray for your priests and parish family in this time apart.

The Adoration Chapel is normally open daily during our office hours, but due to the Governor's "stay at home" order issued beginning Friday, March 27, the chapel will be closed until at least April 10.

Next weekend, Palm Sunday, our priests will bless the palms as usual. We will have them available for you to pick up outside (weather permitting) a table in the large parking lot for you to drive through the parking lot and take some home!

Both priests are available by appointment to celebrate the Sacrament of Reconciliation with you. Call the Parish Office for an appointment 444-4262 or call Fr. Chuck on his cell at 218-324-6572 or Fr. Maschio's office at 218-441-4902. If you cannot receive the sacrament, we encourage you to set aside a few minutes each evening to do an examination of conscience and pray an Act of Contrition.

Pray the rosary with those in your household or call a friend from the parish and pray the rosary together over the phone. Another option is to pray the Stations of the Cross together or start a novena over text or email. Contact and include other parishioners, especially those that are elderly or live alone. Call them just to say HI! and ask how they are doing. They will appreciate that you thought of them and included them. Call the Parish Office if you are willing to do some additional outreach for shut-ins.

This year, our Lenten observance is quite different than other years. We must all do the best we can in this uncertain time to continue to bring Christ's love and hope to one another. The Church (capital "C") has not shut down! We all belong to the Mystical Body of Jesus Christ. We will gather together again (hopefully SOON) to celebrate the Mass and receive the Most Holy Eucharist. See you then!

Baptisms

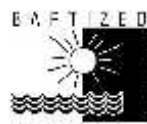

Pastoral Council Elections are coming soon!

Our Pastoral Council enhances the decision-making process of pastoral planning—helping to set goals and develop and implement pastoral programs. The council serves in an advisory role to the pastor. Meetings are held after evening Mass the first Tuesday of each month. (Usually 10 to 11 meetings a year.) Each council member term is for three years, with possible second term (total six years). The election process is scheduled for early May with duties to start July 1. If you are called to serve our parish in this capacity, get Information/nomination forms in the Parish Office or at stphilipsbemidji.org. Names may be submitted to the nominating committee of the Pastoral Council by April 25.

To the St. Philip's Catholic Community Members,

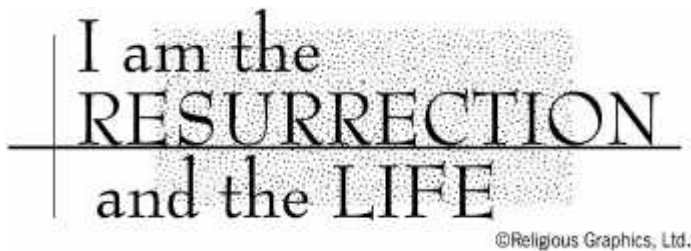

- ✓ First Eucharist will be celebrated during the weekends as soon after the lifting of restrictions as possible.

- ✓ Staff has been reduced in response to the absence of weekly collections.

The Divine Mercy Messenger and the Message

HELEN KOWALSKI WAS BORN IN 1905, The 3rd of 10 children. She lived in Russian occupied Poland.

Early in life St. Faustina showed her love for prayer, work, obedience and care for the poor. Helen heard God's voice for the first time at the age of 7 years. At 19 years old, she joined the Congregation of the Sisters of Our Lady of Mercy where she was given the name Sister Maria Faustina.

From the outside looking in, St. Faustina's life seemed rather unremarkable. However, known only to her superiors, she experienced incredible supernatural gifts that included revelations, visions, hidden stigmata, and other gifts. She had many visions and conversations with Jesus throughout her life. She began her diary at the urging of her spiritual director. Her diary is a collection of 4 years of her life, called, *Divine Mercy in My Soul*. She died in 1938, from undiagnosed tuberculosis. She was 33 years old,

Christ said to St. Faustina, according to her diary: *'encourage souls to place great trust in my fathomless mercy. Let the week, sinful soul have no fear to approach me for even if it had more sins than there are grains of sand in the world, all will be drowned in the immeasurable depths of my mercy.'*
