

St. Charles, Pennington

Sadly, at this time Mass will not be celebrated at St. Charles due to Covid-19. It would be impossible to implement safe practices there because of its limited size and seating configuration. If and when safety restrictions are lifted (prior to Labor Day), Masses will resume in Pennington. Watch the St. Philip's website and facebook for updates.

Covid-19 Updates:

Confessions are being heard at 4:30 PM Saturdays as before or by appointment (discontinued are confessions heard between morning Masses on Sundays). **The chapel** will not be available for seating during Mass or for rosary Sunday mornings, but it will be open during the week for individual prayer. Please enter the chapel through the door that leads into the church (so no one has to touch doors). **Eucharistic adoration** will not start at this time—watch for future updates.

Masses have resumed under certain guidelines...please see further information contained in this bulletin. Note that the first Mass on Sunday mornings will begin at 7:00 AM so there is time to sanitize the church before the 9 AM Mass starts.

We are excited to welcome you to public Mass at St. Philip's!

We wish to joyfully announce that per Bishop Hoepfner's directive, St. Philip's is now open for Mass; there are some criteria that must be followed:

- We can only use 1/3 of the parish's seating capacity. You are asked to sit in designated pews allowing every-other pew to remain empty to ensure at least six feet distancing between persons/families.
- The Social Hall will be used to accommodate overflow. There will be people to assist in seating.
- After each Mass, the doors of the Church will be closed to allow the pews and spaces used to be sanitized. The doors will open when seating can begin. Pews will be sanitized after each Mass.
- Hand sanitizer will be made available (feel free to bring your own).
- Only the Eucharist in the form of Bread will be distributed. There will be no communion procession; the ministers will move through the empty pews bringing Holy Communion to you.
- There will be no holding hands during the "Our Father" and no physical Sign of Peace.
- Receiving communion in the hand is encouraged.
- More details are available below.

The obligation to celebrate Sunday Mass remains lifted; Vulnerable people should consider not gathering in crowds and if you have any of the common symptoms (fever, cough, body aches, etc.), have traveled out of state or country, or have been in contact with anyone known to have Covid-19, should refrain from attending Mass.

At the direction of the Bishops of Minnesota, these directives are to be strictly followed. We pray we can count on you to cooperate! ~Fr. Jerry Rogers

COVID-19 and a push to expand abortion

Some abortion supporters have advocated the removal of certain regulations on chemical abortions in order to make them easier to access during Covid-19. A recent letter signed by a number of state attorney generals asked the FDA to lift restrictions and allow mifepristone (RU-486) abortions using telemedicine. **Planned Parenthood in MN is already participating in a clinical trial in which abortion drugs are sent to women in the mail.** Yet chemical abortions pose documented health risks to pregnant women, and those risks increase when women go through the process without a medical practitioner present.

Regulations Concerning Grave Decorations at Holy Cross Cemetery:

1. Cemetery personnel are not responsible for decorations placed on gravesites.
2. Artificial wreaths may be placed on grave sites during the winter months (Oct 15 to May 1), if erected on a secure stand or easel.
3. It is permissible to place cut flowers on a gravesite provided they are on a grave marker in a container that is not easily blown over or broken. Fresh flowers placed on graves will be removed when wilted.
4. Potted or boxed plants on gravesites must be stable enough for outdoor use and be placed on the grave marker. They shall not be placed around the marker. When wilted, they will be removed and destroyed by cemetery employees.
5. Shepherd hooks may be installed by drilling them into the concrete border of the marker so as not to interfere with the mowing of the grass.
6. Planting trees, shrubs, bushes, flowers and cutting, watering or fertilizing of any grave area may be done only with the permission of cemetery employees.
7. Items placed on graves to mark a birthday or anniversary need to be removed within 10 days after placement. This allows staff to keep the grounds mowed and tended to.
8. **Decorations may be placed on gravesites 3 days prior to Memorial Day and then removed within 10 days after Memorial Day.**
9. Decorations placed outside this time frame will be removed by cemetery personnel to allow for the proper maintenance of cemetery grounds.
