The Solemnity of The Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ *June 14, 2020*

This Sunday we are celebrating the Solemnity of The Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ. In our reading from the Gospel of John, Jesus said to the Jewish crowds, "I am the living bread that came down from heaven; whoever eats this bread will live forever; and the bread that I will give is my flesh for the life of the world." He continued, "Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood has eternal life, and I will raise him on the last day."

This was hard for the Jewish people to understand and is still a mystery today. How does this simple bread and wine that is brought to this altar become the actual Body and Blood of Jesus? And how, by consuming it, do we secure eternal life with Jesus in heaven?

The Catechism of the Catholic Church, in speaking of the Sacrament of the Eucharist says, "at the Last Supper, on the night he was betrayed, our Savior instituted the Eucharistic sacrifice of his Body and Blood. This he did in order to perpetuate the sacrifice of the cross throughout the ages until he should come again, and so entrust to his beloved spouse, the Church, a memorial of his death and resurrection: a sacrament of love, a sign of unity, a bond of charity, a Paschal banquet 'in which Christ is consumed, the mind is filled with grace, and a pledge of future glory is given to us.'"

What a true blessing we have in the Eucharist. Every time that we receive the Eucharist, do we fully value the gift we are receiving, or do we just absent mindedly consume the Eucharist and then go on with our life as if nothing special has happened? The simple fact that we take Jesus into ourselves should make a difference! The Eucharist, Jesus, should shine through and people should see Jesus when they encounter each of us.

This weekend and each of the next few weekends we have children celebrating their First Eucharist. What a blessing for them to be able receive. Please pray for them. May they fully realize the gift that they are receiving and how special it is each, and every time we receive, the true Body and Blood of Jesus our Redeemer!

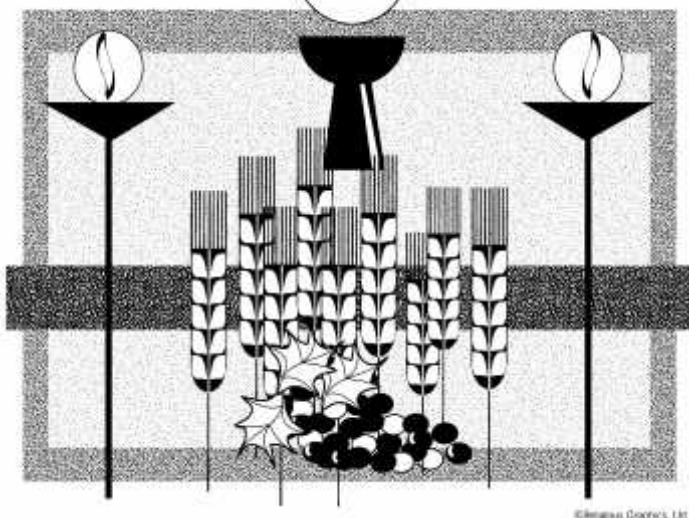

NEWLY RETIRED PRIEST FR. GARY LAMOINE

Father Gary LaMoine served Assumption Parish in Barnesville well past his seventieth birthday, a day that usually marks the end of a Pastor's full time career. Fr. Gary, a Sacred Heart School alumnus, grew up in East Grand Forks. He has served the Diocese of Crookston for 38 years and plans in retirement to substitute wherever he is needed. This summer he anticipates offering Masses at St. Mary of the Lakes, Detroit Lakes.

Fr. Gary's path to the priesthood was unique, he was a professed monk at St. John's Abbey for four years before he decided he wanted to teach and then go on to enter seminary. His priestly ministry began at the Cathedral of the Immaculate Conception with Msgr. Don Krebs, who was a lifelong friend and mentor. Fr. Gary went on to serve parishes across the diocese. His final assignment was Assumption, Barnesville and St. Cecilia, Sabin.

In his final year as Pastor and while in the midst of an enormous project restoring the grand stained-glass windows at Assumption, Fr. Gary went to the local clinic to be treated for the flu. It was discovered to his great surprise that he needed quintuple bypass surgery. His recovery and rehabilitation took nearly a year, but he continued serving his parishes. His pastorate was extended as Fr. Gary waited for the availability of a priest to take his place. Msgr. Roger Grundhaus, former Vicar General of the Diocese of Crookston said, "Priests were always happy to follow Fr. Gary in a parish. He constantly upgraded and maintained his churches. He was blessed with uncommon skills and repairing a church with the work of his own hands was one of his special gifts. He always left a place in better shape than he found it!"

Fr. Gary has always been interested in horses. He spends some time each day caring for his aging quarter horse, Taz, who is boarded outside of Barnesville. He and Taz still go for an occasional ride.

Father tells us he has had a fulfilling experience in his life as a priest and it is hard to believe that 38 years have gone by so quickly. He has been happy in all his parishes and prays he has been of service and done some good, and that he has had a positive impact with the people he has served. We are so indebted to Fr. Gary for his years of humble service.
