In Christ, God's Law is Written on Our Hearts with the Blood of Jesus.

In this weekend's Gospel we see Jesus in Jerusalem. He knows that "*the hour*" is at hand, when He'll drive out "*the ruler of this world*," Satan.

Jesus knows He will soon die and He knows how it's going to happen, as He refers to being lifted up. "*I will draw everyone to myself*," Jesus says, an appropriate reminder to us that He doesn't give His life only for the sins of a few, but so that everyone can be forgiven and redeemed. Jesus chooses to become that grain of wheat that falls to the ground and dies, that it may produce the fruit of salvation for everyone who believes. He tells us that if we're going to serve Him, then we must follow Him, take up our crosses and join him at Calvary – so that one day, we may all share in His victory.

By virtue of our own baptism, we, too, are like a grain of wheat: dying to sin, that we may become alive in Christ. In St. Paul's Letter to the Hebrews we're told that on the cross Jesus "*became the source of eternal salvation for all who obey Him*." We're taught by the Lord that there is a cost to discipleship. Jesus didn't hold anything back in securing our salvation as He took on and defeated our greatest enemies of sin, Satan, and death. We're called, too, to invest in our own salvation, and to be willing to work for it and suffer for it just as our Lord did.

On the cross, Jesus fulfills the new covenant that was called for by the prophet Jeremiah in this weekend's first reading. God's law will no longer be chiseled in stone. Instead, in Christ, God's law is written on our heart with the blood of Jesus. "*I will be their God, and they shall be my people*," Jeremiah says, when he prophesized a new beginning and a fresh start for God's people: "*I will forgive their evildoing and remember their sin no more*." Our God is so willing to freely and frequently overlook all the wrongs we've done, and so, we're commanded to do the same.

As our Lenten journey inches closer to the events of Palm Sunday and Holy Week, we turn our focus to Jesus as He approaches "his hour" on that lonesome road to Calvary. As Jesus *prayed and cried-out* for us and for our salvation, so, too, we must join our pains and sufferings with His. We bring Him our fears, faults, and failings, even our lack of forgiveness, that everything will be washed away by the Holy Water and Blood that flowed from His side as He hung upon the Cross.

God's Blessing on you and your loved ones as we draw closer to Holy Week,

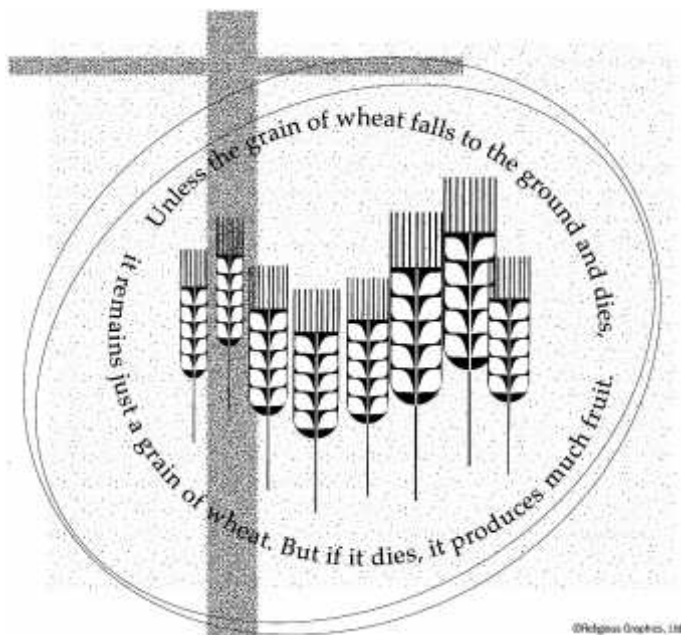
