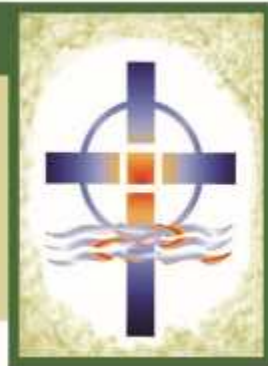

The high-point of any parish's liturgical life is the celebration of Holy Week. Holy Week celebrates some of the Church's most solemn and festive liturgy. We need Holy Week. We need to take Holy Week seriously, because we need the message of Holy Week. The mentality that many people have towards Holy Week is that somehow Jesus is dying and rising and we are keeping vigil with him, instead of the mentality that actually forms the liturgy, namely, this year we are doing the dying and rising -- this year may Jesus die and rise within us!

PASSION SUNDAY:

The Sunday before Easter, traditionally Palm Sunday, is now called Passion Sunday. Christ's triumphal entry into Jerusalem is commemorated this day. Father wears red vestments in honor of Christ our King. After the greeting, Father blesses the palms the people hold in their hands. The prayer reminds us that the palms are primarily for use in the procession. The Gospel passage recalling the first Palm Sunday is proclaimed. The procession begins and all join in song in proclaiming Christ the King. The Passion is proclaimed, reminding us that Christ's kingdom is not of this world and that his throne will be a cross. At all the liturgies, branches will be distributed to everyone as they arrive at Church.

MONDAY, TUESDAY, WEDNESDAY:

These are days traditionally set aside to complete the many chores that might be an obstacle in participating in the Easter Triduum. These are the days for spring cleaning and Easter shopping. The first readings at Mass these days are from the "Suffering Servant" oracles of Isaiah. The New Testament and the Christian Tradition see a fulfillment of these prophecies in Jesus. The Gospels of these days focus on the Lord's words and action during this time of his life: on Monday, we read of his anointing by Mary Magdalene at Bethany, and on Tuesday and Wednesday, we read from the Last Supper discourse excerpts concerning his betrayal.

THE SACRED TRIDUUM:

When the renewed Church Calendar discusses Holy Week and Easter, it stresses that God's glory and our salvation were accomplished principally through the dying and rising of Jesus. His death destroyed our death in sin, and his rising made it possible for us to rise out of Baptism into the new life of grace. So the three day celebration of his suffering, dying and rising is the peak of the liturgical year progressing from the evening Mass of the Lord's Supper through to the celebration of the Easter Vigil. The events of Holy Thursday, Good Friday and Holy Saturday are not distinct events, but rather together comprise the one redeeming action of Christ. The one This understanding as to the message and meaning of Easter is most explicitly proclaimed in the Memorial Acclamation: LORD BY YOUR CROSS AND RESURRECTION YOU HAVE SET US FREE. YOU ARE THE SAVIOR OF THE WORLD. His death destroyed our death in sin, and his rising made it possible for us to rise out of Baptism into the new life of grace. So the three day celebration of his suffering, dying and rising is the peak of the liturgical year progressing from the evening Mass of the Lord's Supper through to the celebration of the Easter Vigil.

HOLY THURSDAY:

The Easter Triduum begins with the evening Mass of the Lord's Supper. Holy Thursday is the recalling of the Lord's Supper when Jesus ate the Passover Meal with his disciples. It was then that he instituted the Eucharist. He commanded his apostles to repeat this action as a Memorial to him. It was then that he washed their feet and gave us an example and command of unconditional love. Unselfish love and service is the theme of this day.

GOOD FRIDAY:

Today, the Church celebrates the passion and death of her Lord. Since Passion Sunday the shadow of the cross has been cast across the liturgy. Today the cross is the symbol which dominates our liturgy. Just as Christians of earlier centuries venerated the true cross, this liturgy reaches its high point in the veneration of the cross. Good Friday is a day of fast and abstinence.

HOLY SATURDAY:

The Church waits today at the Lord's tomb, meditating on his passion and death. The Church refrains from all ceremony until nightfall. During the Vigil Service grief and mourning give way to joy and celebration. The Easter Vigil is the high point of the entire liturgical year.

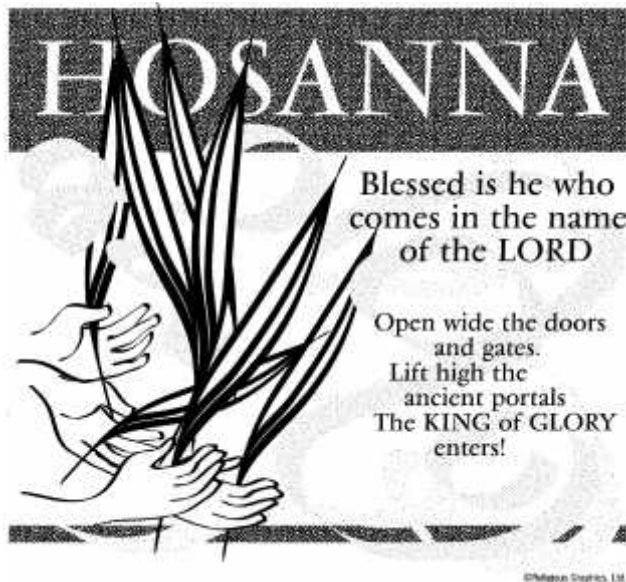

Bookkeeping/Accounting Position Opening

The Parish Bookkeeper is responsible for implementing and performing all financial and personnel recording keeping for St. Philip's Church of Bemidji, along with St. Charles of Pennington and the Holy Spirit Newman Center. This includes all A/R, A/P, general ledger, payroll, bank reconciliations, journal entries, month end and year end reporting. Accurate records must be maintained for several departments. These include the administration, school, faith formation, hot lunch, cemetery, clothing depot, building projects and investments. The bookkeeper also plays a vital role in budgeting and serves as a vital resource to the pastor.

Some post high school accounting/bookkeeping education and/or experience is required. A college degree is not necessary but would be helpful. Salary offer will depend upon education and/or experience. Position is full time and benefits are included. We are currently looking for a June 1 start date as current bookkeeper plans to retire June 30.
