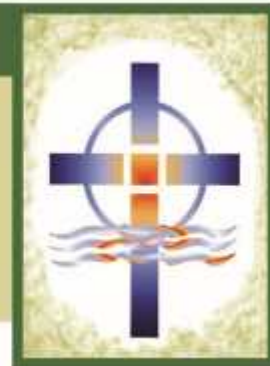

NEWEST COVID 19 GUIDELINES FOR PARISHES IN THE DIOCESE OF CROOKSTON, May 21, 2021

— In light of recent updates to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) and Minnesota Department of Health (MDH) pandemic-related guidance, Diocese of Crookston parishes and entities shall adopt the following "universal" guidelines to mitigate COVID-19:

-) Encourage and support vaccination efforts.
-) Regardless of vaccination status, wash hands frequently;
-) Those who are not vaccinated may be encouraged to wear a mask and social distance.

Regarding liturgical practices and protocols, please note the following:

-) There remain no capacity limits for religious services.
-) There is no requirement to wear masks nor keep six feet of physical distance between households, however, pastors in dialogue with parish leadership can choose to keep one area of worship space for those choosing to mask and distance themselves.
-) Continue to maintain a regular schedule of sanitation, including high touch surfaces.
-) Hand sanitizer should remain available at entryways.
-) Holy water in fonts, stoups and receptacles are allowed.
-) Singing remains permissible. Use of hymnals and other worship aids, such as prayer cards and booklets can be placed in pews.
-) Collection plates and other items can be passed person to person.
-) Physical touch at the Sign of Peace is permissible.
-) Holy Communion under both species and on the tongue is permissible. Altar Servers and all other liturgical ministers are permissible.

In light of the above protocols and permissions in the Diocese of Crookston, we will be reintroducing liturgical practices that we have done without for the past year. Please be aware that it will take 2-4 weeks to resume our previous procedures, prepare the worship space, contact all the ministries regarding any changes, cleaning and filling the holy water fonts, putting hymnals in pews, etc.

Beginning next weekend (Solemnity of the Body and Blood of Christ) we are very pleased to again be able to offer the Blood of Christ at all Masses. Here is a list of reminders for the reception of Holy Communion:

1. Abstain for at least one hour before holy communion from any food and drink, except for water and medicine.
2. The Church allows the faithful to receive Communion up to twice each day.
3. One element or the other (consecrated host or consecrated wine) may be received alone as each element contains the "whole of Christ" – body, blood, soul and divinity. However, Holy Communion has a fuller form as a sign when it takes place under both kinds.
4. Intinction, (dipping a consecrated host into the Precious Blood) is *never* allowed by the communicant or an extraordinary minister.
5. All ministers of Holy Communion should show the greatest reverence for the Most Holy Eucharist by their demeanor, their attire, and the manner in which they handle the consecrated bread or wine.
6. We are encouraged to receive Communion devoutly and frequently. In order to be properly disposed to receive Communion, participants should not be conscious of grave sin.

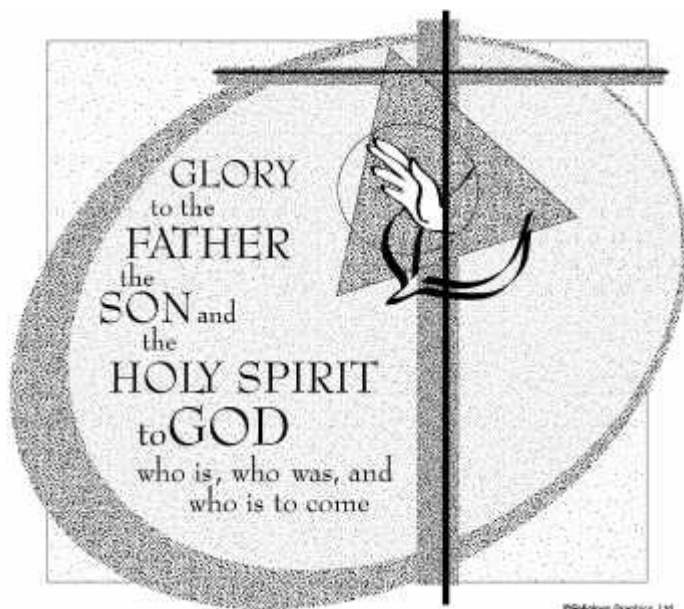
