

Refurbishing Our Prayer Life

July 18, 2021

Prayer and action - these are like the two sides of the coin in our Christian prayer life. But even though I think you'd agree that both of these are equally important for our spiritual maturity, in today's world one of them is harder than the other.

Our society today is so preoccupied with getting things done, on do-lists and action points and bottom lines, that many of us have actually lost sight of which things are really worthwhile doing and why.

- The fast and superficial pace of life in today's digital world makes prayer harder and harder, because prayer requires a person to have internal discipline and depth.

We all face challenges in our lives that interfere with maintaining daily communication (prayer) with our Creator and it's hard to take action and find the time. Yet, right now, we're in the liturgical weeks of Ordinary Time (*that fall between Easter and Advent*). This is a perfect time of year to work on improving our prayer life. And if we ask Him, we can count on the Holy Spirit to help us make it happen.

One way to do that is to make a commitment to a *regular, daily prayer life*, not one that changes with our disposition.

We need to pray daily, to set aside a special, daily "quiet time" when we can, or example, talk with God, pray for our loved ones, reflect on the scriptures, read some really good spiritual book, or come for Adoration time.

That means we need to carve out the time from our hectic schedules.

It doesn't have to take a lot of time - a few minutes in the morning and a few minutes at night is a good start - but it has to be consistent, it has to be every day . . . and that means we have to exercise self-discipline.

In order for this to work, we need to shut off the TV, the computer, and silence our cell phones, because we know that if we don't the beeps and rings from e-mails, texts and phone calls will crowd out our quiet time.

Our Lord Jesus Christ wants us to stay close to Him through prayer. When we pray, He's sitting right next to us listening, a trusted friend, ready to help us refurbish our prayer life, so that with Him we will be able to do great things for God's Kingdom.



Safe Environment Volunteer Information



Volunteers at St. Philip's Parish and School (and throughout our Diocese) who have contact with children, youth and vulnerable adults must have yearly Safe Environment Training and must yearly fill out the Acknowledgement and Consent Form.

All Volunteers (Returning and New) should do the Safe Environment Training as soon as possible, to be Safe Environment Certified. We would like to have ALL Volunteers Safe Environment Certified by October 1, 2021. Volunteers are not cleared to volunteer until the Safe Environment Training, the Acknowledgement and Consent Form, a current background check are completed, and a Safe Environment Certificate is issued to the Parish from the Diocese Safe Environment Office.

Safe Environment Training is offered through the Diocese of Crookston. The training consists of reading Safe Environment Training materials and taking and passing a test. **The recommended method of training is on-line through the Diocese of Crookston Web Site – www.crookston.org** (follow the Safe Environment links). The **Acknowledgement and Consent Form** is also completed at this time. The Web Site is secure. A paper copy of the test is available by contacting the parish/school staff person who oversees you.
