The Twenty-eighth Sunday in Ordinary Time

What must I do to inherit eternal life?

This is the question that the rich man in our Gospel reading today asks of Jesus. How does Jesus respond? "You know the commandments: You shall not kill, you shall not commit adultery, you shall not steal, you shall not bear false witness, you shall not defraud, and honor your father and mother."


