Suffering For Others: The Path to Glory

October 17, 2021

In our Gospel reading this weekend, James and John want glory, and Jesus wants to show them the way, but the way to achieve it isn't what they had expected: suffering for the sake of others. True glory comes from the extent to which we give ourselves to and for others, just like Jesus did.

In Isaiah we hear of the Suffering Servant and the fruits of his suffering for himself and others.

⌋ The Suffering Servant is a prophecy about Jesus Christ, and the "cup" to which He speaks of in today's Gospel is the suffering He knows He must suffer for us.

⌋ Suffering has a purpose in this case: through Christ's suffering we may have everlasting life and the Lord's Will is accomplished.

⌋ We don't like needless suffering, and we look for ways to relieve it. Yet, suffering isn't needless if it has a purpose ... just as Jesus' suffering had a purpose.

In this weekend's Second Reading we see the glory that Our Lord received for drinking the cup of suffering: he became our High Priest by sacrificing himself.

⌋ The Letter to the Hebrews explains that Our Lord, in sacrificing Himself, is made holy as a priest that mediates between God and us and offers sacrifices to God on our behalf. In imitation of Christ, our earthly priests also sacrifice themselves for us.

⌋ Suffering and trials are the way to glory for us as disciples of Christ, but not senselessly: through suffering and trials we may also serve others, giving our lives so they may be "ransomed" from their sins, just as Jesus did for us.

In this weekend's Gospel James and John are seeking glory, but they don't fully understand the path to it or the kind of glory to be won.

⌋ Our Lord doesn't dismiss them but tries to explain what they should expect.

⌋ As followers of Christ, we too may be glorified if we persevere in the faith, but it's the Lord who sets the terms as to what that glory is and how we may achieve it.

⌋ Worldly glories, pale in comparison to what awaits us in eternity. James and John think they know exactly what they want, but what they're expecting is based on human understanding and not the deeper meaning. Yet they are still eager.

⌋ When Our Lord asks them if they're prepared to do what it takes to achieve glory, He's referring to a cup to drink and a baptism to receive, and both refer to His upcoming Passion.

⌋ We have an advantage over these two disciples because we've been shown the path to glory that Our Lord has laid out for us.

⌋ We should seek the glory that not only benefits us, but also others as well: a glory that can only be won by suffering and trials for the sake of others, in imitation of our Lord Jesus Christ.



Interesting Facts: First Order, Second Order, and Third Order Lay Carmelites all share in the same graces and blessings. (First Order are priests; Second Order are monks, brothers, and nuns; Third Order are lay people.) This is unprecedented among all other religious orders. Even bishops and Pope John Paul II have become Third Order Carmelites. In 1917, Mary appeared to 3 shepherd children in Fatima, Portugal. During the last apparition, the sun danced in the sky as approximately 70,000 people watched in amazement. Mary appeared as our Lady of Mt. Carmel with St. Joseph and the Christ Child. Both Mary and Joseph were dressed in Carmelite habits and bless the world with the Brown Scapular.

Carmelite Saints: There are at least 40 Carmelite saints, including: St. Teresa of Avila, Doctor of the Church; St. Theresa of Lisieux, Doctor of the Church; St. John of the Cross, St. Titus Brandsma, St. Elijah, St. Simon Stock, St. Mary Magdalen de'Pazzi, Blessed Elizabeth of the Trinity, St. Edith Stein.
