Prayer, evangelization, works of mercy, service in ministry, volunteering, financial gifts and so much more make up our lives as stewards of the Catholic Church—specifically St. Philip's faith community. Individuals and families are unique in what and how they contribute. No actions are too small—all are appreciated. November (A Month of Giving Thanks) provides a perfect opportunity to acknowledge and express gratitude for every way we together build a vibrant church family. It's also a chance to raise awareness of the stewardship opportunities that present themselves throughout the year.

Some people's stewardship is highly visible (lectors, ushers, greeters, sacristans, Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion, hospitality volunteers, etc. (there always is room for more) others are active behind the scenes (money counters, bulletin folders, Clothing Depot workers, funeral & cemetery volunteers, office volunteers, etc.), some are event oriented (Spring Gala, Block Party, Turkey Bingo, Fish Fry dinners, etc.), some are education oriented (Faith Formation teachers, RCIA sponsors and team, etc.), some defy categories, and some seem to do it all!

Financial stewardship also takes all shapes, sizes, and forms—offertory giving, memorial gifts, endowment creation, tuition assistance scholarships, estate gifts, and uncategorized donations. Some give money from their pockets, direct deposit, online, through investments and IRAs, by designating St. Philip's as a beneficiary on accounts or including the parish in estate planning.

All these efforts build community, support operations, and benefit us all. Some have unanticipated benefits. For example, everyone who has been supporting the Faith in Our Future Campaign through prayer or financial donations is responsible for allowing St. Philip's Catholic school children to attend school in-person despite Covid-19 challenges—those four new classrooms have been a Godsend. I assure you "pandemic preparedness" was not in any of the campaign materials!

Financial contributions call for prayerful consideration. Offertory and special collections are predictable. Others can arise outside our budget plans or direct connection to the church. Please know, WE KNOW, current giving, estate planning, campaign support, and other giving opportunities (raffle tickets, sponsorships, etc.) present challenges and oftentimes call for sacrifice. Please know, your gifts in whatever form, make a difference at St. Philip's, in the Bemidji community, and in the Diocese of Crookston.

We also know stewardship is something you choose to do, but it doesn't occur in a vacuum. It is a challenge to balance priorities—to God, our family, our Catholic community, and our greater community with resource challenges. Higher prices, activity fees and other costs factor into every decision your family makes. Time is limited. A comprehensive (but not exhaustive) list of stewardship opportunities is included in this week's bulletin to help inform decisions.

In Matthew Kelly's 2021 book *Life is Messy*, he asks, "What is essential to the good life? Goodness itself...If you wish to live the good life, fill your life with love, kindness, gratitude, compassion and generosity. Take risks with your goodness. Test the limits of your goodness. Don't just love, astonish people with your love. Don't just dabble in generosity, live a life of staggering generosity."

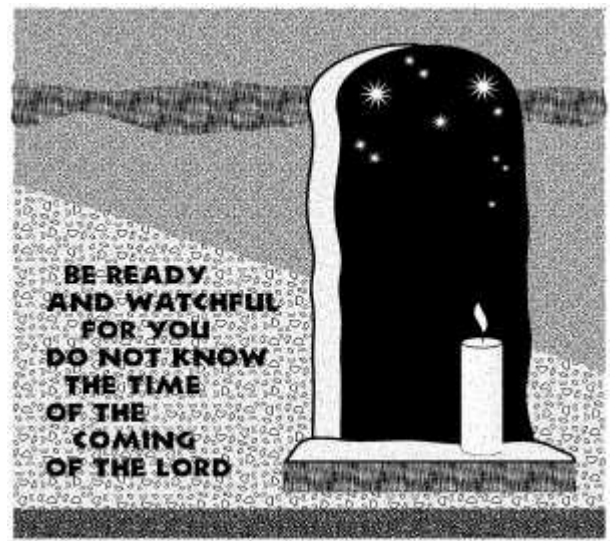
