Meet Fr. Christon Muhero.

Less than two weeks ago, Fr. Christon (ChristON) Muhero traveled more than 20 hours from Blantyre, Malawi in Southern Africa to Ethiopia to Dublin to the U.S. He departed a very warm country (temperature rarely goes below 50 degrees (F)) and arrived in a region about to welcome its first snow the first snow Fr. Christon has ever seen.

He was raised in a Catholic household with six siblings (three brothers and three sisters). His siblings' names are: Nizia, Ritta, John, Ruth, Samuel, and Evelyn. They remain in Malawi along with their

father. Fr. Christon lost his mother several years ago.

This week, Fr. Christon visited the third and fourth grade classrooms to introduce himself. He described Malawi, a country of almost 20 million people as "the warm heart of Africa." He said it's called that because the people there are very friendly. They greet you. They smile at you.

The national language of Malawi is Chichewa (although there are language variations in different tribes). Fr. Christon also speaks English.

Malawi is a poor country that relies heavily on agriculture for food and commerce. Nsima, which is maize flour mixed with water, often accompanies goat meat in meals. In addition, fish from Lake Malawi are a primary food source. The fresh-water lake is the third largest in Africa. More than 260 types of fish live there. Fr. Christon says when you try Chambo fish, you won't want to leave.

Lake Malawi is a large lake with limited recreation areas due to the crocodiles and

hippos. Nature reserves protect elephants, giraffes, lions, and other animals. Hyenas and baboons are considered problem animals.

Fr. Christon's hobbies include reading books about other countries, football (soccer), taking walks and visiting people. He is looking forward to learning how to build a snowman and what ice fishing—and really anything on the frozen lake—will look like.

He especially looks forward to getting to know the students and parishioners at St. Philip's.

We will offer a warm St. Philip's welcome to Fr. Christon after all morning Masses on Sunday, November 28. Stay for cake and coffee / lemonade and introduce yourself to Father!
