November 28, 2021

Today we begin a new liturgical year as well as the first Sunday of Advent. In the first reading today, we hear from the prophet Jeremiah. Jeremiah lived during the most devastating time in the history of Israel. He witnessed the Babylonian invasion of Jerusalem and with it the destruction of the sacred Temple, that had been built by King Solomon. Also, we prepare to celebrate the coming of Jesus in glory when he will establish his kingdom forever. Please don't jump ahead to the Christmas season too fast. There are many graces to gain in the season of Advent. Make this the best Advent season of your life.

Last week we celebrated Thanksgiving and I pray you had a very blessed a peace filled day. Let's continue to give thanks for the many blessings and gifts God continues to bless us with. Especially for most wonderful gifts and blessings that make us the parish of St. Philips.

Together let us enter Advent filled with hope, grace, and love as we prepare for the coming of Jesus.
