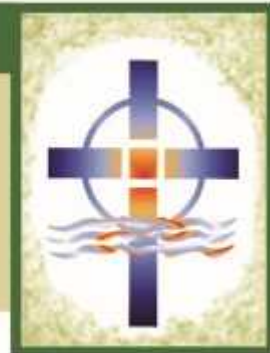

This year from January 18-25 is a week dedicated to the prayer for CHRISTIAN UNITY. When I think of Christian unity what comes to my mind immediately is the prayer of Jesus Christ as found in Jn 17:21- "I pray that all will be one just like you and me are one." Jesus was praying to his Father for the UNITY of his disciples.

This year's theme of the week for Christian Prayer for Unity has been chosen by the Middle East Council of Churches and it is "WE SAW THE STAR IN THE EAST AND WE CAME TO WORSHIP HIM." For us Christians, this reminds us of what we celebrated on Epiphany Sunday. The Magi or the Wise Men from the East who came to adore and praise Jesus represent people from different cultures, races and languages. They shared a common search and desire to worship Christ. This is basically what Unity is all about.

Today the world that we are living in is divided by political, economic, social and religious crises. This has resulted into the death of many people all over the world. People have killed one another because of religious beliefs. The week for Prayer for Christian Unity must help us to look at our STAR-Jesus Christ -who came to unite all human beings despite our differences.

I personally like the theology of St. Paul when he talks about UNITY IN DIVERSITY. Paul talks of one body but having different parts but all the parts work for the good of the body. When all parts are functioning properly, the whole body feels good. Our different cultures, languages, as well as political and religious beliefs are not supposed to be the source of our divisions. We need to see the beauty of being different without destroying the Unity we ought to have.

As we prepare for the Christian Unity Week of Prayer this year, let us look at the different creation of God and be able to appreciate its beauty. In creation we see different things like trees, animals, lakes, stars etc. but these different creatures make the world look beautiful.

Finally, we need to pray that we leave aside our differences and get united in the way God the Father and the Son and the Holy Spirit are. They are different but at the time ONE. The prayer of Jesus Christ still makes sense even today "that they may all be one."

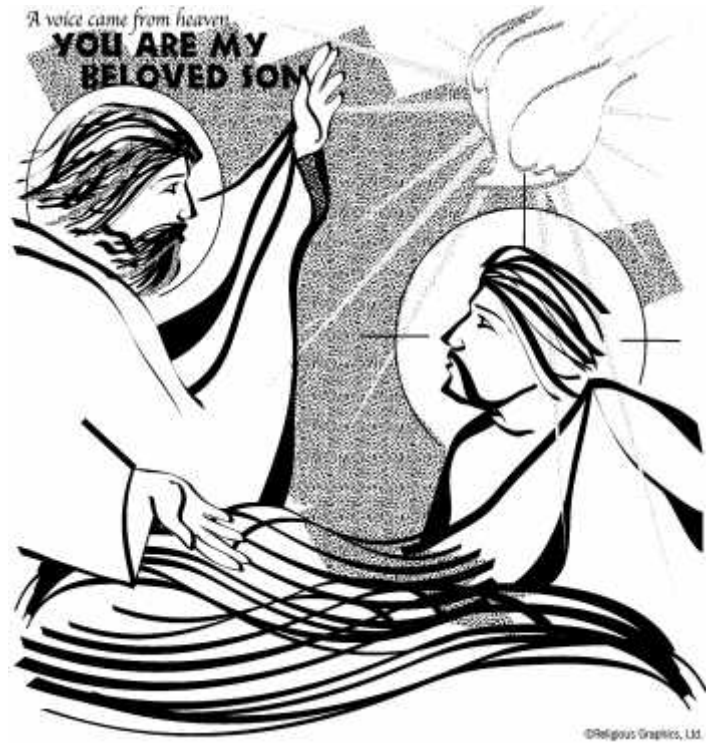

Grieving Resource Library

If you have lost a loved one, maybe you have felt one of the following during your grief: *"It can't be, it just can't be; I never knew that it would hurt so much; part of my heart has been ripped away; no one ever told me that grief felt so much like fear; no one knows the tears still inside me; and finally, death leaves a heartache no one can heal, love leaves a memory no one can steal."*

Where do I find help? At St. Philip's—We have developed a Grieving Resource Library. We currently have 30-some books and pamphlets that could help you through your grief of the loss of a loved one.

Some of the books we carry are:

- **Too Soon A Memory**, a guide for parents suffering a miscarriage. This booklet focuses on the needs of parents who have to deal with a loss that involved tangible memories.
- **Journey Through Grief**, a series of four books: Book one, *A Time to Grieve*, the three N's, normal, natural, necessary. Book two, *Experiencing Grief*, when your loss sinks in, accepting your grief, secondary losses. Book three, *Finding Hope and Healing*, how much longer God? How long does this last? Book Four, *Rebuilding and Remembering*, permission to grieve – again, the first anniversary, rebuilding your life, continuing bonds.
- **Getting Past Christmas**, tips for surviving December after the death of a loved one.
- **When Bad Things Happen to Good People**, how to cope with hard times and personal pain after the loss of a loved one.
- **The Gift of a Memory**, a warm and gentle gift of love that commemorates the loss of a special life and celebrates our most cherished memories.

The books/pamphlets are located in the St. Kateri Room and can be checked out for 2 weeks or more if you need to. If you are not sure which book could assist you, contact either Fr. Bill, Fr. Michael, Fr. Christon, Deacon Kermit or Deacon Robb. *"The journey of grieving takes you from loving in the presence to loving in the absence."*
