OUR GOD TAKES DELIGHT IN EACH ONE OF US

In this weekend's first reading from Isaiah, we hear described the difficult life faced by the Israelites, back in Judah after having been in exile. Life is harsh. The economy is bad. Turning to pagan gods and rituals are very tempting. The Israelite leaders had a difficult job ahead of them to rebuild the once-great city, which was proving to be immense and daunting ... perhaps even impossible. They were beginning to lose interest. They were losing hope. They were losing any motivation to get back into "right worship" of God.

So, the words of the prophet Isaiah become an appeal to the Israelite people to rally. Isaiah won't be silent ... Isaiah won't be quiet ... because he understands the importance of not only the city itself, but also, and most importantly, the temple. For Jews, the temple was the summit of right worship. The Israelite temple was the place where heaven met earth ... where the Divine met mankind. God had chosen the Jewish people as His own and He had chosen to dwell among them.

Everything we read in the Old Testament points us to Jesus Christ. In Jesus, the divine meets the human: "The Word became flesh and dwelt among us" (*John 1:14*). In the Son, God the Father reveals the depth and the abundance of His love for His chosen people ... for all of us.

In this weekend's Gospel, we see Jesus as He performs His first miracle while at the wedding in Cana. This is important because it reveals to us God the Father's intention. God intends to join Himself to His creation. He intends to bring us back into right relationship with Him. We hear Isaiah prophesy that God would once again delight in His people, rejoicing in us like a bridegroom does his bride. Where once there was desolation, there would now be fruitfulness. From water would come the best wine.

Like the Jewish people, who were facing a situation that appeared hopeless, often-times we can see our own circumstances from a similar perspective. Our readings this weekend, however, remind us that we have a God who delights in each one of us. We have a God who longs to join Himself to us so He can breathe His divine life into us and to make us new and whole. Like Isaiah, we must never be silent. Instead, let us acknowledge God's effort and action in our lives, and proclaim His wondrous deeds to the world.

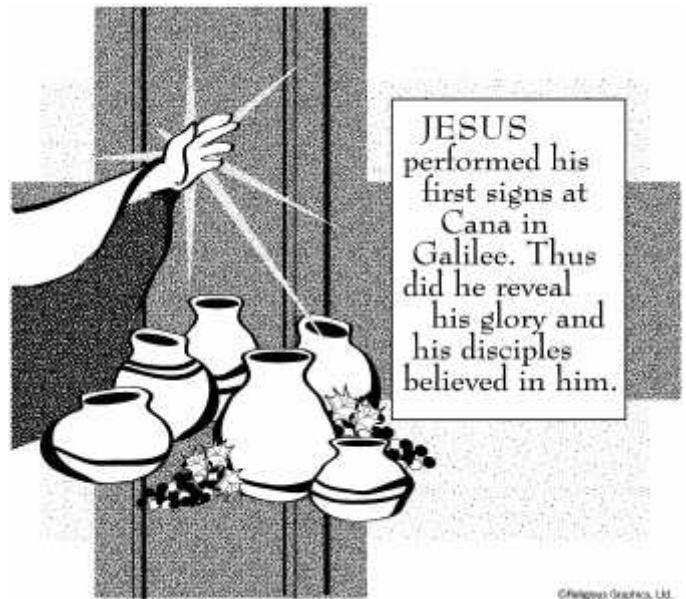
