We Are Called to Be Merciful

February 20, 2022

The readings from this weekend are about mercy, and about following Christ's teachings and example. In the first reading, David shows mercy by not killing Saul while Saul is sleeping. He had plenty of opportunity, because the Lord had kept Saul's guards in a deep sleep. This made it possible for David to take Saul's spear and water jug and get away without anyone waking up. David showed great mercy by sparing Saul's life.

In this weekend's Gospel reading we hear Jesus' Sermon on the Plain. Jesus commanded his disciples to love their enemies. He went on to say that they're to be merciful, just as the Father is merciful. In another section of the reading, Jesus tells them to stop judging and condemning, and to be forgiving and generous. As much as they forgive, they will be forgiven, and as much as they give, they will receive.

Jesus is asking not only His disciples, but also us, to rise beyond our basic human natures. In sinful ways, we come to hate our enemies and we retaliate when we're wronged. We keep what is ours, and only give when we expect to get something in return. It's natural for us to be most interested in ourselves because we're sinners (*even sinners love those who love them*). But Jesus teaches us to be merciful just as our Father in Heaven is merciful. Even God is kind to the ungrateful and the wicked (*which, in other words, means us*). We're to be merciful because we've been shown mercy. We're to treat others not just as we would want them to treat us, but by showing them the same kindness that God has already shown us.

In this weekend's second reading we hear about Paul writing to the Corinthians about the nature of the risen body. He explains that just as we have borne the image of the earthly Adam, so, too, will we bear Christ's heavenly image. We are invited not just to follow Christ's teachings, but to conform our lives to Christ. Our Lord Jesus Christ is the one who makes it possible for us to be as merciful as the Father. Through His Incarnation, He's taken-on our earthly flesh, our very nature (*though*, *of course*, *without sin*), and He's restored in us that likeness of God which our sin has destroyed.

Our Lord Jesus Christ has ascended into heaven, where He is seated at the Father's right hand, until He comes again to judge the living and the dead. There's no need for us to judge our enemies. Christ is the only one whom God the Father has given the authority to judge. When we meet Him, we must hope that Christ recognizes us and welcomes us home. We must allow this hope in the final reward will be our motivation to defeat selfishness and greed, to look beyond our own self-interests, and to be as generous and forgiving as our Lord Jesus Christ.

The following letter is from a member of the third order Carmelite Community member at St. Philip's. Kim became involved with the community when it began here. She wanted to share with the parish, her witness on what the third order community means to her.

After 33 years in human resources, (as a) wife and mother of two boys, early retirement for me was a conscious decision to place God first in my life, thirsting for a deeper prayer life, simplicity in my lifestyle, daily devotions, service in the Church and deeper meaning in the next chapter of my life. With over 15 years of being an adorer of Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament, I decided to pursue certification to be a distributor of Holy Communion to serve the elderly confined in the nursing homes. This has been a gift from God to serve him and his precious elderly souls.

My thirst to grow in my relationship with Jesus continued, as I looked to his Mother and completed the Michael Gaitley book, 33 Days to Morning Glory (a consecration to Mary), which led to 33 Days to Great Glory (a consecration to the Father through Jesus) and the Father Don Calloway consecration to St. Joseph. In 2020, my husband and I relocated to Bemidji, MN, became members of St. Philip's where I heard about a Third Order of Lay Carmelites, starting in September.

Little did I know what I would find. A group of like-minded sisters (and/or brothers) to help me grow deeper in my faith. Our monthly 75-minute meeting, we share our prayer requests, united we pray the Liturgy of the Hours together in voice we praise God and harmonize with our hearts, understanding the Bible and especially the Psalms. We study the upcoming Sunday gospel and share using the Lectio Divina model.

I've learned the Liturgy of the Hours is the prayer of the whole "People of God." In it, Christ continues his priestly work through his Church. In my daily morning and evening prayer routine at home, it's a beautiful thing to imagine being a part of his Church members from around the world, participating according to their place (consecrated or laity) in this prayer, lifting up our hearts.

As we've studied the life of some of the Carmelite Saints like St. Teresa of Avila, St. Therese of Lisieux, St. John of the Cross, my eyes have been opened to the depth of their interior life, their total trust and genuine love of God, and the presence of God they find in the ordinary. I've come to realize this is the deeper meaning God intends for my life.

God is good and he's good all the time. I'm blessed beyond my imagination by this Carmelite Ministry as I continue to learn, grow and become the person God wants me to be; more like his Son. As our leader prays with us, "Keep Mary in your mind and Jesus will grow in your heart".


