Alleluia, Happy Easter!!!

In the dark hours after the crucifixion, what was it like for the disciples? Jesus had been put to death; he was gone, laid in a tomb. Was this the end? Did anything have meaning anymore? They still wanted to believe in him, yet they were struggling to open their hearts.

There is a quiet contrast between those dark hours and the early morning that heralded the dawn of the first Easter Day. It was then that Mary of Magdala and the other women disciples went to the tomb and found that it was empty. Mary believed that the body of Jesus had been taken away. When she ran to tell Peter and John what she believed had happened she sought the help of men whose individual behavior had been very different at the time of Jesus' trial and crucifixion. Peter had denied three times that he even knew Jesus, but John had stayed close to the cross and remained with Jesus to the end, as had Mary, the mother of Jesus, and the other women. But now, united in grief, Peter and John run to the tomb, see the grave clothes and believe that until then they had failed to understand: "that he must rise from the dead". For all of these disciples the truth of the resurrection dawns upon them slowly.

No one witnessed the resurrection itself, but Christ in his love sought out the disciples, opened their hearts and reawakened their faith by appearing to them, risen from the dead. The change that then came about in his followers was a new beginning, inexplicable in human terms, for it was a glimpse of the world to come when we shall see God "face to face". In the words of St Bede: "Christ is the morning star who when the night of this world is past reveals to his saints the eternal light of life."

My dear friends today marks a new beginning for all of us. We are a resurrection people and today we once again share in the resurrection of our Savior. It is a new beginning as we continue our journey with "Christ the morning Star."

We start our Easter celebration in joy by congratulating those who were confirmed and received the Holy Eucharist at the Vigil Mass. Then, this Easter season our parish will be a season of celebrating the sacraments. Many Baptisms are scheduled, First Holy Communion for many youths will be celebrated at the end of the month, and in May we will be blest with the Sacrament of Confirmation. God continues to bless St. Philip's with great joy and hope.

First, let us celebrate Easter, our Savior has risen from the dead into life for us all! A very blessed and happy Easter to you!

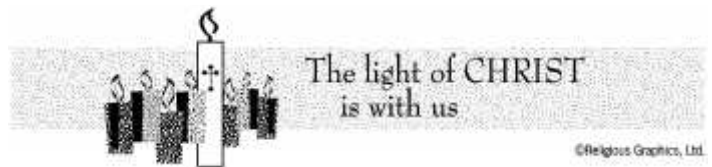

Next week we will take up the **Catholic Home Missions Appeal**. The Sunday of Divine Mercy is April 24

Fr. Michael Arey will officiate at the **2 PM** service. The feast and the veneration of Jesus in the image, will be explained. There will be time for group veneration and individually. At 3 PM The Chaplet of Divine Mercy will be sung, followed by benediction and repose of the Blessed Sacrament.

In 1931, in Plock, Poland, St. Faustina received a vision of our Lord, Jesus. He tells her to paint an image of Jesus according to what she sees, with the signature of "Jesus, I trust in You"

Jesus spoke to St. Faustina many times during her life concerning the veneration of Jesus in the image. *On the Feast of Divine Mercy, tell the whole world of my great mercy. I desire that this image be displayed in public, the first Sunday after Easter. Through the Word Incarnate, I make known the bottomless depth of my mercy. At 3 o'clock implore my mercy, immerse yourself in my passion. I will allow you to enter into my mortal sorrow. In this hour, I will refuse no thing to the soul that makes a request of me in virtue of my passion. Whoever approaches the Fount of Life (Jesus in the Divine Mercy image), on this day, will be granted complete remission of sin and punishment.* (To benefit in all the grades, receive confession and communion within 10 days.)

Jesus extended this grace to the whole world. When people pray the chaplet of Divine Mercy for a sick or dying person, the same forgiveness will be granted.

To learn more about Divine Mercy, attend the Divine Mercy Cenacle, that meets the first and third Wednesday every month, at 9:30 AM in the St. Elizabeth Room.

Feeding Hope

The St. Philip's community strengthens that hope through its continued compassion and support of the Bemidji Community Food Shelf. The 2022 FoodShare drive raised \$7,048.30 through parishioner contributions. Additional donations affiliated with the parish were \$1,000 from the Knights of Columbus and \$5,000 from the Clothing Depot for a total of \$13,048.30.



Through various sources, the Food Shelf can use each donated dollar to provide almost four meals to an individual facing food insecurity. The \$13,048.30 converts into nearly 52,000 meals for the hungry. And each one of those meals feeds the hope that Christ brought to this world.
