By now we are all familiar with the phrase “**National Eucharistic Revival.**” In brief, the Bishops of the US are calling for a three-year grassroots revival of devotion and belief in the Real Presence of Jesus in the Eucharist. Here in the Crookston Diocese, we are blessed because our Bishop is overseeing this Eucharistic Revival nationally, and here at St Philip's, we are blessed too because the Diocesan function to launch this very important event will take place here on ***Corpus Christi Sunday***—What a blessing!

In its simplest meaning a ***REVIVAL*** means a renewed attention to or an interest in something. In our context, National Eucharistic Revival will give us an opportunity to have a renewed attention to the Eucharist. It will give us an opportunity to have a special interest in the Eucharist. It will give us an opportunity to love the Eucharist more and receive the graces we need from it.

When we talk of Real Presence of Jesus in the Eucharist, what we mean is that Jesus Christ is present in the Eucharist, NOT merely symbolically or metaphorically, BUT in a ***true, real and substantial*** way. It is true that Jesus is present to us in many ways but only in the Holy Eucharist is He uniquely present—body, blood, soul and divinity. The Eucharist is a real and tangible presence of Jesus Christ with us. This is what we believe as Catholics.

When we read the Catechism of the Catholic Church, it strongly asserts the “Real Presence” of Jesus’ body in the Eucharist, this is to say that the sacrament is not symbolic of the body and blood of Jesus but rather it is His body and blood.

We are all invited to come and participate when our Bishop will be launching this very important function beginning with the Holy Mass at 1:00 PM and then the procession with the Holy Precious Body, the Eucharist, at 2:00 PM. Let us all make use of this time to deepen our love for the Eucharist. Let us take some time to reflect on what St. Thomas Aquinas wrote about this great Sacrament:

- **tantum ergo sacramentum** — So great therefore a sacrament.
- **veneremur cernui** — Let us venerate with bowed heads.
- **et antiquum documentum** — And the ancient document.
- **novo cedat ritui** — Gives way to the new rite.
- **praestet fides supplementum** — May faith supply a supplement.
- **sensum defectui** — For the defect of senses.

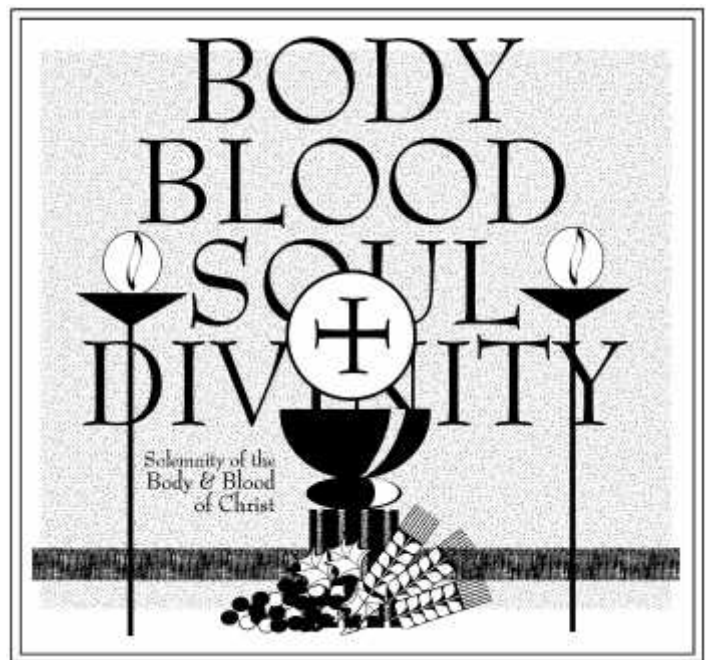
