Happy Twenty-Ninth Sunday in Ordinary time,

October 16, 2022

The weather has sure taken a turn this week. I guess we knew it had to be coming, but it is still disappointing to us, to have the high temperatures drop to under 50 degrees. In a few months we would be excited to have highs in the 40's. We know that as the seasons change our expectations change and we just have to go with whatever the weather brings.

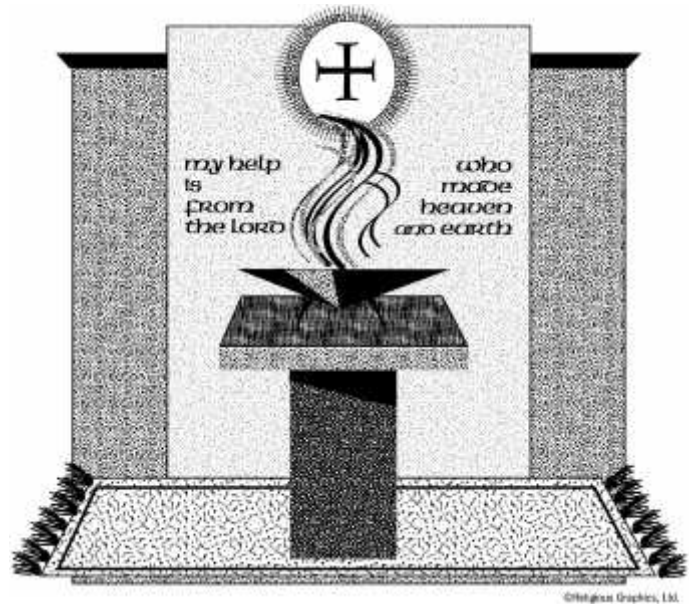

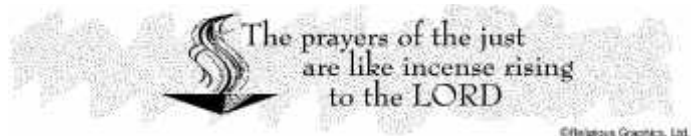
