Second Collection Next Weekend

Our parish will take up the **Collection for the Archdiocese for the Military Services, USA (AMS)**, next weekend, a collection approved by the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops to be taken every three years. The AMS provides pastoral care to Catholic men and women serving in the U.S. Armed Forces, enrolled at a U.S. Military Academy, being treated as a patient at any of the 153 U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs Medical Centers, or who work for the federal government beyond U.S. borders - including those from our own parish and diocese. The AMS does not receive any funding from the government or military, and has no parishes from which to receive a weekly assessment. Safe Environment Training Opportunities

Volunteers are essential to St. Philip's Parish/School! We all must work together to create and maintain safe environments on our campus and in our programs. The Diocese of Crookston provides a structured Safe Environment program to support that goal. **The program requires all volunteers who have contact with children, youth, and vulnerable adults to complete yearly Safe Environment Certification. The Safe Environment Training program has been revised; it is all on-line.** The Diocese of Crookston contracts with Catholic Mutual Group to administer the Safe Environment Training. St. Philip's will assist volunteers who do not have access to a computer. (See training dates below.) **Sessions will be limited to 10. Contact the Parish Office at 218-444-4262 to reserve a spot.** We will provide the computers to complete the training. Training will take approximately 90 minutes in the St. Elizabeth Room.
