CELEBRATION OF CHRIST THE KING

November 20, 2022

The Solemnity of Christ the King, which every Catholic throughout the entire world is celebrating this weekend, is something relatively new. Although the Church has existed for almost 2000 years, this Solemnity is less than 100 years old, first established by Pope Pius XI in 1925. His reasons for doing so were laid out in an encyclical letter called *Quas primas* ("in the first," Latin).

First, he explained that throughout history liturgical feasts have been instituted in response to special needs that come up in the life of the world and the Church.

He then uses the example of the feasts in honor of the martyrs, of the celebration of Corpus Christi and the Sacred Heart.

Lastly, he explains the need for this new celebration.

Pope Pius was writing this encyclical in 1925, when the world was still recovering from World War I, which had devastated Europe and shattered the world's hopes for what was referred to as unlimited "progress based solely on human reason." It was also just a few years after the Russian Revolution, which had created the world's first explicitly atheist, totalitarian regime: Soviet communism. Everywhere he looked, the Pope saw human societies abandoning Christian values and trying to build paradise on earth through other means.

But if humanity had been able to bring itself to perfection, without God's help, then Jesus Christ would never have come to earth. Yet the fact is, Jesus *did* come. He brought His Gospel and His grace to a fallen humanity, and only by believing in that Gospel and accepting that grace can individuals and societies achieve true and lasting peace and prosperity.

Pope Pius XI instituted today's Solemnity to remind the world that to reject Christ, either privately or publicly, is to reject our only hope, and to accept Him is to accept salvation.

As Pope Pius IX wrote: "...When once men recognize, both in private and in public life, that Christ is King, society will at last receive the great blessings of real liberty, well-ordered discipline, peace and harmony. That these blessings may be abundant and lasting in Christian society, it is necessary that the kingship of our Savior should be as widely as possible recognized and understood, and to that end nothing would serve better than the institution of a special feast in honor of the Kingship of Christ."

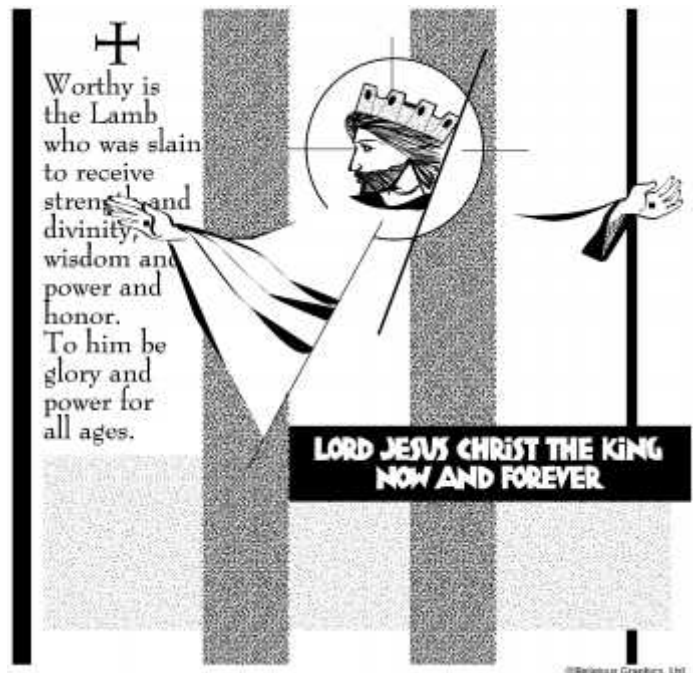

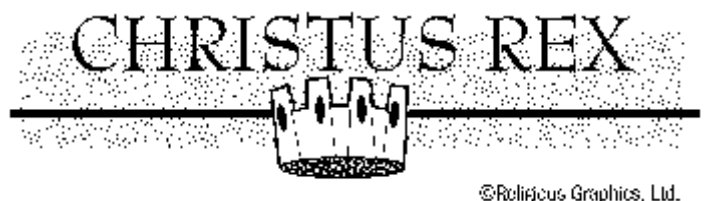

Carmelite Corner

Lay Carmelites of The Most Pure Heart of Mary

200 years after the Carmelite hermits were settled on Mount Carmel, near the spring of Elijah; they were forced by invaders, to move to cities in Europe. The lay groups that began developing, were called Carmelite Oblates or Donati. The approval of these lay groups came with the bull, Cum Nulla issued by Pope Nicholas V in 1452. These groups, that could live outside the convents and cloisters became identified as Tertiaries. These groups of lay Carmelites are expected to co-operate in the new evangelization that permeates the entire Church, today.

Safe Environment Training Opportunities

Volunteers are essential to St. Philip's Parish/School! We all must work together to create and maintain safe environments on our campus and in our programs. The Safe Environment Training program has been revised; it is all on-line.** The Diocese of Crookston contracts with Catholic Mutual Group to administer the Safe Environment Training.
