It is a common tradition to decorate our homes at the beginning of Advent in anticipation for Christmas. Decorations can vary from household to household, but a common decoration is the Christmas tree. How each family or household decorates their tree may vary. The color and the size of the tree and the ornaments can be different, but where did the tradition of the Christmas tree originate? To answer this question, we can look back to the eighth century.

St. Boniface was an eighth century missionary (praised by Pope Gregory II) who brought Christianity to Germany. St. Boniface was born with the name Winfrid, and many historical documents refer to him as Bishop Winfrid, stating that he went to Germany to preach the Christian faith as a missionary from the Church of Rome. After a period of successful Gospel preaching, Boniface went to Rome to confer with Pope Gregory II. After a long absence, he returned to Geismar, Germany, for Christmas in the year 723, and felt personally offended on discovering that the Germans had reverted to their former idolatry of pagan gods and were preparing to celebrate the winter solstice by sacrificing a young man under Odin's sacred oak tree. Filled with holy anger, Boniface, proved these gods powerless, and felled the oak tree with the stroke of an ax. This courageous, historically documented act meant the triumph of Christianity in Germany over the pagan gods. All this is historically documented. The rest belongs to the legend which tells how, at the first blow of the axe, a strong gust of wind instantly brought down the tree. The astounded Germans fearfully recognized the hand of God in this event and humbly asked Boniface how they should celebrate Christmas. The Bishop, the legend continues, pointed to a small fir tree that had miraculously remained upright and intact beside the debris and broken branches of the fallen oak. Boniface was familiar with the popular custom of taking an evergreen plant into the house in winter and asked everyone to take home a fir tree. This tree signifies peace, and as an evergreen it also symbolizes immortality; with its top pointing upwards, it additionally indicates heaven, the dwelling place of God.

Pope Paul VI began the tradition of setting up a massive Christmas tree beside the grand crib in St Peter's Square. Today, The Christmas tree can be the symbol of the peace that Jesus brought, that must be re-established between God and human beings. Because it is evergreen, it is the symbol of that immortality which Jesus said he possessed and would bring to us: "I am the life; those who believe in me even if they die will live". The tree lit by little lights is the symbol of the light that Jesus brought to the world with his birth: "He was the light that shines in the darkness... and enlightens every man..." (cf. Jn 1:4-14). And finally, the fir tree, with its tip pointing to heaven, indicates God's presence to us and the place where we are all awaited. All this endows the Christmas tree, in harmony with the crib, with the religious and Christian significance of salvation that the Son of God brought to the whole world by his humble birth.

Minnesota's Abortion Extremism Exposed...

Several abortion restrictions in Minnesota were ruled unconstitutional by a district judge in Ramsey County on July 11, 2022, (known as Doe v. Minnesota legislation). This July ruling struck down existing pro-life laws in Minnesota, including:

- Woman's Right to Know (2003) women are no longer provided with informed consent info before abortion.
- Parental Notification (1990) parents need not be notified before abortion is performed on a minor.
- Doctor Only (1974) Non-physicians may now perform abortions.


