In Latin there is a saying which goes "Tempus fugit." It literally means time flies. I left Africa, Malawi on 8th November last year and arrived here in the USA on the 11th. Of course, I had heard and read a lot about this beautiful country but for me I was coming to an unknown area. ..I had no clue as regards to what type of people I would meet here, what kind of culture I was diving into and what kind of food I was to eat, what kind of treatment I was going to experience. Like Abraham in the Old Testament, I had to leave for an "unknown" land but with confidence and trust that God always accompanies his chosen ones. Like Jesus Christ who sent his disciples in pairs to preach the gospel of his kingdom, my Archbishop also did likewise. He sent me here with my friend Fr James Khembo who is serving in East Grand Forks and his advice was, I am sending you like missionaries and I know you are classmates and I hope you will be able to support and encourage each other where that is needed and necessary. Probably he was also not sure of what life had in store for us. Having spent one year, I had a little reflection of my stay. The first thing that I have to say is to thank God for all the wonderful graces he has shown me in my priesthood. As I shared with some of you, I was ordained a priest on 26th July 2003 and in all these years, I have seen God's care and graces in different ways in my priestly ministry. My being asked to come here was like another calling within my priestly calling. However, this has helped me to grow spiritually, emotionally and even socially. That is what happens when you are in a new environment with a different culture. There are lots of things that need adjustment. One may not understand this fully until he/she is into it, and I now understand it much better than before.

For the one year that I have been here, I have experienced tremendous love, care and support from many people of this beautiful and active parish. Fr. Bill, our pastor has been one of the wonderful persons for me. From the word go, he helped me to get settled quickly. He is a wonderful person, always ready to help and offer directions and full of humor too. Fr. Michael was the one who used to take me around town especially for winter night walks when it was very quiet and "scandalously" cold. He used to say that that was a good time for meditation because there is no noise and one can appreciate God's nature and beauty of creation with a serene mind. I would like to say thanks to our ever charming two deacons for their support and to a wonderful and jovial group of parish and school staff. These people have been very supportive and caring to me, always making sure that I feel at home. There are a lot of parishioners who have shown me a lot of love like among other things, inviting me to their homes and different places for dinner, giving me warm clothes, taking me to the lake for fishing, helping me with driving around town when I was getting my license, praying for me, buying me my favorite goat meat and coming to my office to greet me and say a word of encouragement. I look back at this one year with a sense of gratitude to God and all the people who have come into my life. Of course, there have been challenges but challenges are always part of our life, and they help us to grow. I am looking forward to another year with optimism, always remembering that we are only earthen vessels trusted with heavenly treasures and so in our ministry we must trust the Lord that he will always give us the graces we need to serve him better. May God bless our parish!



Campus Security Update


