Do you have a call to the priesthood or religious life? Do you know someone that may have a call to the priesthood or religious life? Is there a child, grandchild, family member, or friend that you think has a calling to serve God and His Church? We all have a vocation and this means we have a call from God to a distinctive state of life, in which we can reach holiness. Vocations to the priesthood or religious life are distinct calls from God to share in His mission in the world.

The priest is an "alter Christus" which is Latin for another Christ. He is called to be a witness of Christ to the flock that has been entrusted to him as their shepherd. He is a minister of the sacraments, proclaimer of the word, teacher of the faith, and steward of the Church. The priest is meant to accompany and lead the flock entrusted to his care through this world in such a way as they are able to reach the eternal kingdom of heaven.

Men and women called to live religious life as religious sisters and brothers or monks and nuns are also called to this act of accompaniment. They are called through a life dedicated to poverty, chastity, and obedience to be a witness of the life of heaven living here on earth. They are to serve as a reminder and an encouragement to us to live our own lives with hearts and minds fixed on Christ.

If you or someone you know is discerning a vocation to the priesthood or religious life, we have two groups currently meeting in our parish to support vocations. The first group is the *Melchizedek Project*. The Melchizedek Project is a nationwide initiative to form small discernment groups at colleges, high schools, and parishes, that provide information and support for young men as they discern a vocation to the Catholic priesthood. Most young Catholic men lack the in-depth information they need to prayerfully discern the priesthood. Small discernment groups provide a good support structure for men as they "dive deep" into the discernment process. Anyone in high school or older is welcome to join us. We meet every first Thursday of the month at 7:00 PM at St. Philip's in the St. Elizabeth Room.

The second group is *Avow*. Avow was created by Mother Clare Matthiass, CFR and Vianney Vocations. The goal is to help women draw closer to Jesus as they discern a possible vocation to religious life. We use the tried-and-true model of "discernment groups" because they *work*. When women learn together, pray together, and support each other, it's much easier to discern with clarity. Avow uses a similar format as The Melchizedek Project. Avow does not recommend any particular religious community. It helps women discern religious life "in general," while encouraging them to explore communities that God has placed in their path, or to which they have a particular attraction. **Anyone in high school or older is welcome to join us. We meet every fourth Thursday of the month at 7:00 PM at St. Philip's in the St. Elizabeth Room.** 

If you have any particular questions or are interested in joining our meetings or are discerning a vocation to the priesthood or religious life, please feel free to reach out to me by calling my office phone or by emailing me at: **frmichael1@stphilipsbemidji.org**. ### 602 Beltrami Building Update

Father Bill has asked me to serve as the Project Manager for the remodeling of that building that St. Philips purchased from Remax. The parish has purchased the property and will open a new daycare facility once we have completed some remodel and safety upgrades. I will try to provide occasional updates so that members of our parish are informed on our progress.

Although no actual remodeling has yet started, there is a lot of work happening in the background. We have held on-site meetings with multiple licensing/permitting authorities so that we have good assurances that our remodeling will result in being able to open our doors as a four-pod daycare center. Some of the issues that have been addressed:

- · Met with State Fire Marshall.
- Joint meeting with County Daycare Licensing, Fire Department Rep, and City Building Official.
- Invited Parish and School staff over to "claim" furniture they can use.
- Invited local Non-profit organization to come in to claim furniture not needed by parish.
- Contacted trades people that are members of St. Philip's to provide input and feedback.

The next step will happen this next week when the architect walks through the building and begin developing final plans. He estimates that will take approximately three weeks. We will then get a building permit, secure contractors, and begin the remodeling process. The good news is that by engaging the city building official early in the process, we do not anticipate challenges with that process.

This is a beautiful building and will serve our parish very well. Larry Mack, Project Manager






