I would like to take this opportunity to thank all of you for supporting me and this next step in my vocational discernment as I prepare to move to Saint Paul Seminary this September. It has been a pleasure to meet many of you over the last few weeks. Your generosity and kindness has left its mark on me; I consider it an honor to discern serving you and the entire diocese of Crookston as your priest.

I was asked to share a little bit about my story with you in bulletin form. If you would like to know more about my story or want to share your own, don't hesitate to flag me down! I am always happy to share how the Lord's merciful love molds and directs all of our lives.

Despite growing up in a strong Catholic family, my faith never interested me very much. God seemed distant and separate from my life outside of the Mass. As I grew, my relationship with the Lord shrank. When I left for college to pursue a music degree, I stopped going to Mass and started indulging my flesh with pleasure and intoxication. When I won an audition with the Air Force bands in 2017, my musical ambitions were satisfied and I suddenly had financial stability. I believed that this new state in life would guarantee my happiness, but after 2 years I found my life more meaningless than it was before I entered the Air Force. I know now that this was God calling me out of the darkness and into the light.

During this time I became aware of the philosophical arguments for the existence of God. These arguments fascinated me because I was not aware that a person could make convincing arguments for God; I thought faith required the absence of logic. Over the next year I conducted many hours of research into God, Christianity, and ultimately the Catholic Church and became convinced that the Catholic Church is God's church. After going to Confession and Mass for the first time in years, a heavy burden was lifted from my shoulders. I felt compelled to serve Jesus with everything he had given me; I wanted to give my life to him. It was immediately after this first Mass that I knew God was calling me to the priesthood. I served the rest of my contract with the Air Force before moving to Bemidji and continuing my discernment. With the help of Father Bill, Father Michael, and my parents, I discerned that the Lord is calling me to Saint Paul Seminary.

When I leave for Saint Paul in September, my hope is that we all continue to pray for vocations and conversion. I was freed of my separation from God through these prayers, and the harvest is still plentiful. Please pray for me and my formation as well; I will be praying for you.



#### **Holy Souls/Purgatory Devotion**

Have pity on me, have pity on me, O you my friends, for the hand of God has touched me! (Job 19:21)

Is the word "Purgatory" mentioned in Holy Scriptures? The simple answer is "no" - the word Purgatory does not occur in the Bible. The concept of Purgatory is a faith tradition extending back before the time of Jesus. Although a number of Old Testament passages are interpreted to support the tradition of Purgatory, after-death purification, and praying for the dead, the verse from 2 Maccabees 12:41-45 (NRSV Catholic Bible) is most often used.

**41** So they all blessed the ways of the Lord, the righteous judge, who reveals the things that are hidden; **42** and they turned to supplication, praying that the sin that had been committed might be wholly blotted out. The noble Judas exhorted the people to keep themselves free from sin, for they had seen with their own eyes what had happened as the result of the sin of those who had fallen. **43** He also took up a collection, man by man, to the amount of two thousand drachmas of silver, and sent it to Jerusalem to provide for a sin offering. In doing this he acted very well and honorably, taking account of the resurrection. **44** For if he were not expecting that those who had fallen would rise again, it would have been superfluous and foolish to pray for the dead. **45** But if he was looking to the splendid reward that is laid up for those who fall asleep in godliness, it was a holy and pious thought. Therefore he made atonement for the dead, so that they might be delivered from their sin.

This week, pray for the souls whose memory has vanished from this world, whether because of the passing of time, or the lack of family and friends to pray for them.


