As we approach Labor Day it would be good to actually reflect on the value of labor especially through the lens of our faith. I just want to share some words with you from Fr. Juan Lorda, he is a Catholic priest and professor who lives in Spain. I have always been edified by his words of wisdom. Regarding labor he says the following:

Our culture encourages people to think a lot about making good use of time. People try to multiply their activities, working feverishly and multitasking. Some are moved by the need to make a living, others by the passion for possessions and money, others by a desire for their own fulfillment. Meanwhile, still other people try to work as little as possible and avoid anything they find difficult. They love free time though they don't know how to use it and are bored. They seek to escape reality, with no intention of improving it. Many people fall between these two extremes. The greater part of time and energy of a mature person is devoted to work. This is a noble reality, desired by God. From the beginning God created man, "to work" (Gen. 2:15). Work is mankind's original vocation. It is a blessing from God, and those who consider it a punishment are sadly mistaken. The Lord, who is the best of fathers, placed Adam in the Garden of Eden so that he would work. We obtain our sustenance, contribute to society, and serve others by working. Work develops our personalities and obliges us to acquire virtues. It teaches us to concentrate, schools us in obedience, and is the matrix of social relationships. These natural qualities of work are ennobled by its Christian meaning. For a Christian, work is an occasion to love God, serve one's neighbor, and collaborate in the divine tasks of the creation and redemption of the world. This Christian meaning of work must be kept in mind in order to give direction to what we do, preserving us from useless activism and wasting time. Usually, it is a matter of doing what we already do with a new mentality.

Work is a privileged opportunity for serving. Often, one must work to support oneself and one's family. But one's work is not a mere commodity for sale. It is service to others, and that spirit of service dignifies it, whether one is a businessman or production line worker. The sense of service is especially important in performing public tasks. The fundamental criterion of honesty in this sphere is the common good. This is true for public servants at all levels and of all ranks. Without the sense of service to the common good, they are at risk of giving in to self-seeking and even dishonesty.

It is not Christian to look down on any kind of work. All work is an opportunity to serve others and meet God. The Christian sense of a call to holiness give dignity and charm to all tasks. All work that is done for the love of God is an encounter with Him.





Children's Liturgy of the Word

First Reconciliation Parent Sessions



Two First Reconciliation Parent Sessions will be held: Wednesday, September 7 at 6:30 PM or Tuesday, October 3 at 5:15 PM in the Social Hall. These sessions are for parents who will be

preparing their child (2nd grade or older) for First Reconciliation this year. It is the policy of the Diocese of Crookston that the reception of the Sacrament of Reconciliation precedes the reception of First Eucharist. A parent must attend one of the sessions for the child to receive the sacrament, regardless of if you have attended a session in the past. These sessions will be the only parent session offered for First Reconciliation this year.

Holy Souls/Purgatory Devotions

In last week's Holy Souls/Purgatory Devotions article, the question posed was, "Should we consider establishing a Purgatorial Society here at St Philips?" The next logical question would be, "What does a Purgatorial Society do...?" Purgatorial Societies serve the following purposes:

- 1. To be a visible sign and reminder of an often forgotten portion of our Church the Church suffering or the Holy Souls in Purgatory.
- 2. To offer prayers unceasingly, both individually and as a community, for the Holy Souls. This is a key mission for society members since the souls in Purgatory can no longer pray for themselves.
- 3. To gather alms and ensure Masses are offered for the Holy Souls. Since Masses for the Holy Souls are most efficacious, this is another key mission for a Purgatorial Society.
- 4. To offer guidance to the Church community as a whole on offering prayers for the Holy Souls, exercising Church indulgences, and understanding Church doctrine on Purgatory.
- 5. To provide for and participate in Church-wide activities to assist the Holy Souls. These include First Friday Holy Hours, events during November (Holy Souls month), and visitations to and work at Church cemeteries.


