Blessed Are the Merciful

September 17, 2023

Mercy and forgiveness many times resist our fallen human nature.

- Frequently, we tend to play favorites, hold grudges, resent insults, demand our "rights," and care much more about our own hopes, plans, and problems than about others'.
- When we **do** take an interest in other people, it's usually because **we** like them, and **not** because God loves them so much that He sent His Son to die on the cross for them.
- When we operate on this merely natural level, we run into a limit in our ability to forgive those who offend or harm us.

In today's Gospel, Jesus is teaching us that a Christian is called to have no **limits** to their forgiveness, and to be merciful as God is merciful.

We're fortunate and glad in how God is gentle and patient with us:

- J God is always willing to forgive us,
- God is always showering us with His blessings,
- God is always there when we need Him,
- God is always ready to understand us,
- God is always ready to sympathize with us before judging us.

We're fortunate and glad that God is merciful with us, although we know we don't really deserve it!

And yet, we're often hesitant to treat others that same way. Just like the man in today's Gospel parable.

If we don't let God help us overcome that reluctance, our hearts will become so shut down that eventually Christ's mercy simply won't be able to get in. If we do overcome it, our hearts will open wider and wider, allowing the full flood of God's love to wash over them, making them a safe harbor for others who suffer . . . attracting their kindness and generosity.

Blessed indeed are the merciful, for showing mercy is the only way to invite it.

23 So when you are offering your gift at the altar, if you remember that your brother or sister has something against you, 24 leave your gift there before the altar and go; first be reconciled to your brother or sister, and then come and offer your gift.

(Matthew 5:23-24)

Why do we have Purgatory if our sins are forgiven in the Sacrament of Reconciliation? The following story highlights the difference between the two. A person was visiting at a close friend's home. While there, the two got into a bitter argument over a trivial difference. The argument became physical to the point where items in the person's home were broken. ken. The two friends parted ways in anger. After a time, their anger subsided and the friends reunited. All was forgiven and forgotten, and they continued in their friendship. Feeling remorse over the broken items in the home, the person visiting the home made full restitution to replace the items. The Sacrament of Reconciliation delivers God's forgiveness for our sins. Purgatory provides our souls the chance to make restitution for our sins.

This week, pray for souls who did not properly honor the Lord in their lifetime.

It is with great joy and appreciation that I announce, "We have exceeded our Capitol Campaign goal of \$500,000 to repair the roof and replace boilers." The generosity and prayers of parishioners, guests, and local businesses made it possible. Thank you, thank you.






