November is the month dedicated to the Poor Souls in Purgatory. Although we can and should pray throughout the year for the deceased, the Church provides wonderful opportunities to earn indulgences for the Souls in Purgatory particularly during the first week of November:

- One can gain a plenary indulgence by visiting a cemetery each day between November 1 and November 8 (also known as the Poor Souls' Octave) and praying for the departed, even if the prayer is only mental. These indulgences are applicable only to the Souls in Purgatory.
- A plenary indulgence, again applicable only to the Souls in Purgatory, is also granted when the faithful piously visit a church or a public oratory on November 2. In visiting the church or oratory, it is required that one Our Father and the Creed be recited.

The usual plenary indulgence conditions apply: receiving Communion, going to Confession and prayers for the Holy Father. Praying for the souls in purgatory doesn't end on November 8. The whole month is dedicated to the faithful departed. Even outside of the Octave, one should plan on visiting local cemeteries throughout the month and pray for the Souls of our loved ones and all those who have departed from this world. November

is the time of year with more reminders of "dying" or ending. The Liturgical Year is ending soon; the last Sunday of the Church year (Christ the King) is November 26. The liturgy of the last weeks of Ordinary Time focus on the Four Last Things: death, heaven, hell, and final judgment. The Church wants us to think of our ending. Our cemetery visits are walks in nature, viewing the autumn season with falling leaves and the "dying" or hibernation for winter, the end of the growing season. Our prayers and actions during November for the faithful departed are opportunities for all of us to make internal connections, and deeper connections with the members of the Communion of Saints.

Eternal Rest, grant unto them, O Lord, and let perpetual light shine upon them. May their souls and the souls of all the faithful departed, through the mercy of God, rest in peace. Amen.





## DAYS FOR I

#### Excerpts from Fr. Ambrose: Conscience considerations surrounding vaccines.

Taken from Population Research Institute website: www.pop.org. "Ethical considerations surrounding vaccines have been debated for some time. Ques: Is it true that COVID-19 vaccines are created using organs of aborted infants? Ans: When we first heard about the experimentation on human embryos and fetuses many years ago, most of us were incredulous. It is difficult to imagine the perversion of the human heart which justifies the use of vital organs of infants, even if the intention is to help others. This is a grave thing to do to anyone, but the sin is compounded and increases in gravity when that person is innocent and defenseless. Even if we had used the body of only one infant that was spontaneously aborted, it would be a grave injustice.

The Eugenics movement which dawned in the 1920's oversaw the forced institutionalization and sterilization of the 'feebleminded' and made medical experimentation on human beings 'acceptable'. Following this and well into the 1970's, organ harvesting on live fetuses of gestational ages of 3-4 months was not uncommon."
