



Winter Volunteers Needed at Food Shelf

The majority of volunteers at the Bemidji Community Food Shelf are scheduled through local churches. St. Philip's provides volunteers to assist clients in selecting food for their households during three shifts each month: the morning shift on the third Wednesday, and the morning or afternoon shifts on the fourth Monday.

With current usage of the BCFS reaching pre-pandemic levels, at least eight volunteers are needed to staff each shift. The volunteer list from our parish is usually sufficient to cover those time periods.

That changes, however, in winter months when many current volunteers head to warmer climates. Replacements are often needed from January through March.

Excerpts from Fr. Ambrose: Conscience considerations surrounding vaccines.

The currently available Covid-19 vaccines use fetal stem cells (a parent cell that can keep reproducing) in either their production (by using them as a container to culture the viruses) and/or in their testing (the vaccines are then tested on these cells to elicit safety and response on a cellular level). To grasp the gravity of the use of aborted fetal cells in the medical field, it is necessary to be aware of the steps required to arrive at a 'successful' outcome. In simple language: several infants of a gestational age of 2-4 months are screened, picked for their gender, race and pristine medical history. The date of the abortion is chosen, labor is induced, organs are extracted while the child is alive with no anesthesia, while the heart is still beating and blood is circulating. This part is crucial to ensure viability of the organs. The organs are then transported to their destination, a research lab.

In any court of law, a crime that used such methods would be called pre-meditated mass murder and torture. It is so grave that no reason whatsoever can ever justify it. Church teaching has consistently and systematically condemned abortion in all its forms. It is a clear violation of God's Commandment, *Thou Shalt Not Kill*.


