Tamara Moore Please call the Parish Office for information. **Almsgiving (and Lent)** (cf. Daily Rosary Meditations 1/19/24)

This week we begin the season of Lent. Lenten tradition calls us to give special attention to prayer, fasting and almsgiving. The term almsgiving, first of all, brings to our mind those who will benefit from our charity. However, almsgiving and generosity bring blessings to us in terms of conquering the vice of greed. Greed is the disordered love of money and things you can get with money. The best practice to counteract greed is to give alms to donate money to something from spiritual motivations.

Most people don't think that they are greedy but would admit to often being preoccupied with money. Our culture thinks of money as the measure of success. We think of education as preparation for finding a good career which is code for a job that pays enough money. We are very much concerned about car, mortgage, and medical payments. We want to be sure we have enough money for our kid's schools, weddings or our own retirements. Many vote based primarily on "the economy". That means that many of us act as though the biggest issue facing our nation is money — not immorality or godlessness. Maybe that is why Christ explicitly reminded us that we can't serve God and money. So, what can we do to show that we do, actually, value God more than money?

Our most fundamental problems never stem from not having enough money. We need more God. So God has given us a way to show that we don't need more money. Everybody thinks they do. They say, "We're barely making it; we're just hand to mouth." However, how many who say that are actually malnourished or homeless? And we show that we aren't slaves to money when we voluntarily give some of our money away. Christ says we have to choose —Me or money? And the way you can actually make that choice in practice is by almsgiving.

You choose Christ over money when you give your money to Christ. There are two groups Christ identified Himself with: the Church and with the poor. So give to the Church and those organizations who work for the mission of the Church, and give to those who are poor whether in body or spirit.

The primary reason to give alms is to give yourself to Jesus in return for all He has given to us. We miss the point when we think the primary reason we give our money is to bring about some good in the Church, world or for some people. We give our money because it represents ourselves which we want to give to Jesus.

There are two potential problems with giving to the Church or to the poor — they may waste it or use it for bad purposes. We don't give to them because they will be the best stewards of the funds. We give because Jesus identifies with them.

According to Scripture, which means God, we should be giving 10%. A good formula is: 4% to your parish, 1% to the Diocese and 5% to other organizations that take care of the poor. Consider taking time assess where you unnecessarily spend money and give that money to the Church, to good organizations that are helping people grow closer to Jesus, and give to the poor.

St. Philip's Volunteers Needed for Food Shelf

The Bemidji Community Food Shelf needs your help. Volunteers from St. Philip's helped those facing food insecurity by assisting individuals in selecting food during the morning shift of the third Wednesday of each month as well as on the morning and afternoon shifts on the fourth Monday of the month. Each shift lasts a little over three hours with the first starting at 9 a.m. and the second at noon.

Prior to the surge in record numbers, seven volunteers were needed to staff each shift. It now takes at least nine individuals to service users in a timely fashion.

A large number of St. Philip's regular volunteers head to warmer climates during the next few months, which leaves shifts shorthanded. New volunteers are needed to fill in during this time.

Fasting, abstinence

- Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are obligatory days of fasting and abstinence.
- Lenten Fridays are obligatory days of abstinence from meat.
- The norms on fasting are obligatory from age 18 until age 59.
- When fasting, a person is permitted to eat one full meal. Two smaller meals may also be taken, but not to equal a full meal.
- The norms concerning abstinence from meat are binding upon members of the Catholic Church from age 14 onwards.


