The Church in the Modern World

Some years back, my brother Paul took some courses at St. John's University at Collegeville. Introduced to the Vatican II documents, he could not stop talking about how inspiring they were and insisted I put parts of them in the bulletin. I thought of him when I recently read these words in our Office of Readings:

"The world of today reveals itself as at once powerful and weak, capable of achieving the best or the worst. There lies open before it the way to freedom or slavery, progress or regression, brotherhood or hatred. In addition, man is becoming aware that it is for himself to give the right direction to the forces that he has himself awakened, forces that can be his master or his servant. In man himself many elements are in conflict with each other. On one side, he has an experience of his many limitations as a creature. On the other, he knows that there is no limit to his aspirations, and that he is called to a higher state of life.

Many things compete for his attention, but he is always compelled to make a choice among them, and to renounce some. What is more, in his weakness and sinfulness, he often does what he does not want to do, and fails to do what he would like to do. In consequence, he suffers from a conflict within himself, and this in turn gives rise to so many great tensions in society.

Very many people, infected as they are with a material way of life, cannot see this dramatic state of affairs in all its clarity. Many think that they can find peace in the different philosophies that are proposed. Some look for complete liberation for man from man's efforts alone. There are those who despair of finding any meaning in life; and they commend the boldness of those who seek to impose a total meaning on it only from within themselves.

But there is an ever increasing number of people who are asking the most fundamental questions or are seeing them with a keener awareness: What is man? What is the meaning of pain, evil, of death which still persists in spite of such great progress? What can man contribute to society, what can he expect from society? What will come after this life on earth?

The Church believes that Christ died and rose for all and can give man light and strength through his Spirit to fulfill his highest calling; his is the only name under heaven in which man can be saved. So too the Church believes that the center and goal of all human history is found in her Lord and Master.

The Church also affirms that underlying all changes there are many things that do not change; they have their ultimate foundation in Christ who is the same yesterday, today and forever." (Vatican Council II --1962-65 - Read the 16 documents yourself)





Abortion in the Minnesota Constitution?

Already, state legislators last year enacted a law establishing abortion-up-to-birth in Minnesota statute. But that law could be repealed by future pro-life legislators and a pro-life governor. That's why abortion supporters want to put unlimited abortion in the Constitution itself—because it is much harder to change and would likely solidify Minnesota as an abortion haven for a long time to come.

The exact wording of the amendment isn't known yet, but it would—if passed by the legislature and then approved by voters—enshrine abortion-up-to-birth in the Minnesota Constitution. *It is very important that you contact both your state representative and state senator—regardless of how you think they will vote. *Visit mccl.org/extreme* for more information. 

I desire that this image be displayed in public, the first Sunday after Easter. Through the Word Incarnate, I make known the bottomless depth of my mercy. At 3 o'clock implore my mercy, immerse yourself in my passion. I will allow you to enter into my mortal sorrow. In this hour, I will refuse no thing to the soul that makes a request of me in virtue of my passion. Whoever approaches the Fount of Life (Jesus in the Divine Mercy image), on this day, will be granted complete remission of sin and punishment." (To benefit in all the graces, receive confession and communion within 10 days.)

Jesus extended this grace to the whole world. When people pray the chaplet of Divine Mercy for a sick or dying person, the same forgiveness will be granted.

To learn more about Divine Mercy, attend the Divine Mercy Cenacle, that meets the first and third Wednesday every month, at 9:30 AM in the St. Elizabeth Room. Pamphlets are located in the Narthex.

St. Philip's Prayer Chain


We would like to let you know of a "new" prayer ministry at St. Philip's that we are looking for interested parishioners to be a part of: a St. Philip's prayer "chain"




