Sponsored by the St. Gianna Pro-Life group of St. Philips in Bemidji.

- 1. Children in each grade are asked to draw a poster promoting life.
- 2. Themes might be to stop abortion, or to be a thankful theme for life.
- 3. Posters, using standard poster board, could be in any artistic format: pencil, pen stamp; ink, paints, markers, etc. (But not glued on items, as will be apparent in a later section.) It should be bold and readable from a distance.
- 4. Posters will be judged by members of the St. Gianna group, members of the Knights of Columbus, and one of our priests or deacons.
- 5. Winner will get a gift certificate to a local restaurant, plus a donation will be made in his or her name to the Northwoods Pregnancy Care Center.
- 6. Winning poster will be produced as a banner to lead our annual Pro-Life March, proposed to be on January 20, 2024. (Being able to scan and reproduce the image is why cut outs and glued-on items should not be used.)
- 7. The winning poster will be reproduced as placemats for use at the luncheon following the march (or for other events).
- 8. Poster due date will be Dec. 20, 2023
- 9. The fruits of this effort are to discuss pro-life issues in classrooms and at homes (as students discuss ideas with their parents).

Building pro-life values in our youth may be our best long-term approach in overcoming the decades of abortion advocacy in our society.

Perhaps this effort could in time spread throughout our diocese, and around the country.
