### **ECO-TIP OF THE WEEK: Trust Your Dishwasher...**

Don't rinse your dishes before you put them in the dishwasher. If you spend more than a minute rinsing your dishes before you put them into the dishwasher, you are more likely doubling the amount of water that is actually necessary in the cleaning process. Dishwashers use much less water today than they used to, and they tend to do a very good job cleaning. If you have a really dirty plate and think that it needs to be rinsed before you put it in the dishwasher, instead wipe the food away with a cloth. All of your dishes will still clean just as well.

### **Becoming a Catholic (RCIA)**

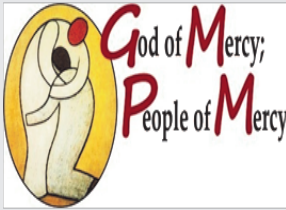
