Summer Mission Trips-Outreach In Our Name

Our young people were amazing these past two weeks as they served others in Jesus' name at "Just5Days", a mission trip for middle school students and "Young Neighbors in Action," a mission trip for high school students.

From July 16-22, a small contingent of youth and adults from OLOS joined approximately eighty other high school students and adults in Worcester, Massachusetts to take part in the Young Neighbors in Action. Youth members Jon Dion, Conlen O'Driscoll, Josiah Stessman, and Vy Uong were joined by adult leaders Sean O'Driscoll and AnneMarie Dion to serve at the South Worcester Neighborhood Association—an inner-city day camp for underprivileged children ages 6-12 years. Over the course of our service week, they immersed themselves in the day-to-day routine of the camp—joining the children as they ate breakfast, played endless games of kickball and soccer, ate lunch, read books and completed book—reports, played on the playground and most importantly, made friends and listened to the life stories of the children they served. The youth also served as role models and were greeted each day with hugs, excitement and anticipation.

From July 24-28th, eight OLOS students (Alejandra Aguilar, Michael Campisano, Ava Detrask, Charlotte Foulger, Conor Grew, Barry Spoto, Noah Tolentino, and Josh Tolentino) and their adult leaders (Teresa Coda and Dominic Grew) joined approximately thirty other middle school students and adults to volunteer, build community, pray and learn in the community of Springfield, MA. The OLOS team served at Kate's Kitchen and Margaret's Pantry — a soup kitchen, food pantry, and thrift shop — for the week, where they served meals, sorted items donated to the organization, cleaned thrift-store closets and checked expiration dates on food donations.

A huge and hearty thank you to the adult participants on the Just5Days and YNIA trips (and the parents who helped drive students to and from Springfield: Lisa Foulger and Kimberly Detrask) and to all of the OLOS parishioners who made our trips possible through their prayers, support of our Car Wash fundraiser, and other donations. May our students' love and compassion for others continue all the days of their lives and may they continue to be role models and an inspiration for us all.
