Pastor's Desk

NOVEMBER

We begin the month of November as we did on Friday with the Feast of All Saints and dedicate the month in a special way to all those who as the liturgy says: "have gone before us marked with the sign of faith." In fact on Sunday, November 3 at the 11:00 AM Mass we will remember especially all our parishioners whose funerals were here at OLOS this past year. Please join us.

The larger significance of all this is that November turns out to be the month when we celebrate the communion of saints. This teaching of the church defies in a way the separation of time and eternity. Saints is a word in common parlance that we reserve for those so declared by the church through canonization. But the communion of saints refers to the saints in heaven, the souls in purgatory and the faithful on earth. So it includes our genealogical ancestors, our ancestors in the faith and us. In a very real sense, this title is not reserved for the New Orleans football team or the Mormons. It is a proper title for us, the people of God, the faithful here at OLOS.

We have much to learn from our ancestors but we bring our own particular brand of sanctity to the table. God does not want us to be Mother Teresa, Dorothy Day or St Francis. God wants us to be most fully ourselves, to put our own brand of sanctity on human experience. As Thomas Merton said: "For me to be a saint means to be myself."

Pope St John XXIII verified Merton's view in his book "Journal of a Soul." "I am not St Aloysius, nor must I seek holiness in his particular way but according to the requirements of my own nature, my own character and the different conditions of my life. I must not be the dry, bloodless reproduction of a model, however perfect. God desires us to follow the example of the saints by absorbing the vital sap of their virtues and turning it into our own life-blood, adapting it to our own individual capacities and particular circumstances. If St Aloysius had been as I am, he would have become holy in a different way."

We are already members of the communion of saints. Let us strive to put our own stamp on it, confident in the grace of the Father, the Love of the Son and the inspiration of the Holy Spirit.
