Pastor's Desk

I'm sure you've started your shopping for the Christmas presents that will show your loved ones that you care for them. Like our giving tradition at Christmas, God lets us know that he loves and cares for us by giving us a Christ of compassion, healing, mercy, forgiveness, peace and love. And in the Advent season we recall the anticipation of that gift.

Imagine the almighty son of God being born in a broken down stable and then laid in a manger where animals come for their food. But, how fitting. How fitting that the one who came to proclaim God's love to his people was born simply and silently, as that's how God's love abides within us. How fitting and symbolic it is that **he** who would become the bread of life for all of us in the Eucharist was laid in the vessel in the stable that holds the food for its creatures. 



In April, 2011, Cardinal Séan Patrick O'Malley, entrusted to her the mission of establishing a new religious community of sisters in the Archdiocese of Boston, Daughters of Mary of Nazareth.

The Blessing of an Advent Wreath

The use of the Advent Wreath is a traditional practice which has found its place in the Church as well as in the home. The blessing of an Advent Wreath takes place on the First Sunday of Advent or on the evening before the First Sunday of Advent. When the blessing of the Advent Wreath is celebrated in the home, it is appropriate that it be blessed by a parent or another member of the family.

All make the sign of the cross

Leader: Our help is in the name of the Lord. Response (R/.): Who made heaven and earth.

Reader: Let us listen to the words of the Prophet Isaiah (Isaiah 1-2 and 5-6) (Alternately, Isaiah 63 (lines 16-17 & 19) or Isaiah 64 (lines 2-7) may be used).

The people who walked in darkness have seen a great light; Upon those who dwelt in the land of gloom a light has shone. You have brought them abundant joy and great rejoicing, As they rejoice before you as at the harvest, as men make merry when dividing spoils. For a child is born to us, a son is given us; upon his shoulder dominion rests. They name him Wonder-Counselor, God-Hero, Father-Forever, Prince of Peace. His dominion is vast and forever peaceful, From David's throne, and over his kingdom, which he confirms and sustains By judgment and justice, both now and forever. The zeal of the LORD of hosts will do this!

Reader: The Word of the Lord. R/. Thanks be to God.

Leader:

Lord our God,
we praise you for your Son, Jesus Christ:
he is Emmanuel, the hope of the peoples,
he is the wisdom that teaches and guides us,
he is the Savior of every nation.
Lord God,
let your blessing come upon us
as we light the candles of this wreath.
May the wreath and its light



be a sign of Christ's promise to bring us salvation.


May he come quickly and not delay. We ask this through Christ our Lord. R/. Amen.

Dear Fellow Parishioner:

For where two or three are gathered together in my name, there am I in the midst of them. Mt 18:20. How blessed we are!

As the holidays approach it's that time of year again when we begin our Grand Annual appeal. I've only been here for five months but have already witnessed the generosity of the people here both with their time and their treasure. And I want to acknowledge and commend you for all you have shared in the past. The Grand Annual appeal is important to our parish in that historically it has supplemented the weekly collections so we can meet all of our budget goals. We also rely on this collection to support the ongoing projects that the age of the buildings here necessitates. Soon you will see new carpeting in our church which will really beautify our worship space. But the sound system, the ventilation system and additional electrical upgrades are projects that we need to keep in our sights for the future.

The Grand Annual is especially important this year as we have continued to return our liturgies, evangelization, and religious education to a pre-pandemic in-person reality. Last year you increased your giving to the Grand Annual such that we had our strongest ever collection, eclipsing the \$100,000 mark for the first time. An amazing accomplishment in what have surely been difficult times for everyone. Thank you!

In the past couple of years, we had help from government sponsored grants to continue our payroll through the reduced income we experienced as the result of the shutdowns. We don't have the benefit of those grants this year; and with the increase in our ability to gather comes additional costs. Most specifically are the costs of compensation for our wonderful staff to facilitate the in-person gatherings and build on the community that we love so much. And just as everyone is experiencing the negative impacts of inflation, so too is our parish. We have seen sharp increases in many of our costs, particularly in utilities and insurance. However, even with careful stewardship our budget for this year shows a shortfall in excess of \$50,000. Therefore, if you are able, we are asking for your prayerful consideration of increasing your Grand Annual gift from last year to help close the gap. Anything will help ensure that we can continue to be the vibrant welcoming community that makes OLOS so welcoming.

We have included a pledge card in this mailing for your convenience. You can also donate stock or give directly from an IRA for a tax advantage. Donating electronically is also encouraged. It is convenient and adds predictability for the parish revenue stream.
