

Pastor's Note

Dear parishioners and friends of Our Lady's, What a beautiful day for our parish community to celebrate the Mass at the Lake. The sky was blue and high, the sun was warm and shining, and the people were happy and joyful. I, personally, was greatly excited simply because of the weather and the number of people present. Mindful that the forecast was for unpredictable weather, we certainly cannot deny God's divine intervention because of our prayers and the intercession of Our Blessed Mother.

The answer to my long-asked question, "Why would the Sorrows of the Blessed Mother become a great celebration for us?", now becomes clear. By sending me to Sharon, God is revealing the answers to me. No one likes suffering, yet, paradoxically, suffering is unavoidable in our lives. The great positive attitude that our community has shown from as early as 1906 when this parish changed its name to Our Lady of Sorrows is undoubtedly faith-inspiring. Not only did the early members of this parish know that God and His beloved ones all endure sorrow, but also they knew well the Sorrows of the Blessed Mother who is dear to us who love life. The earliest members of this church understood the three dimensions of Mary's faith as explained by Pope Francis: the Journey that Mary, the first disciple, took to visit her cousin Elizabeth, the Compassion that Mary as a mother showed to the world during the sufferings of Jesus, and the Prophecy that Mary embodied, as a model for all future followers to be ready to take up Jesus' cross with love.

Friends, how blessed we are to be part of this community. Just as the Son of Man suffered greatly for our sake (cf. Lk 9:22) and just as the Blessed Mother bore all the sorrows of accompanying her Son, Jesus, so we also go through life carrying our own deep sorrows which can be transformed into joy through our faith. Mary did not flee from Jesus' suffering but stood with Him though all. We pray that Our Lady of Sorrows and her Son walk closely beside us and lift up whatever crosses and burdens we bear in life.

From the bottom of my heart, I thank all of you: God and the people of Our Lady of Sorrows. I am indeed blessed to be part of this community. As we hear in this Sunday's Gospel, God is so generous to us.

Eucharistic Adoration






Breakfast Donations for Mainspring House


